Manager Thornley and Members of the Reno City Council,

I'm Ski Broman, an owner of 324 E. 4th Street. Together with my business partner, we're currently immersed in the substantial renovation of this property to transform it into a distinctive restaurant, bar, and event venue. Our investment and commitment to this project is driven by our belief in the vibrancy of the Old Brewery District and the 4th Street business community. I am commenting today in full support of the staff recommendations on taking next steps for items D.4 and E.1.

Regarding item D.4, I urge the council to take action on the sale of 315 and 335 Record Street to one of the qualified respondents to the public Request for Proposal (RFP). I believe that a local developer who understands the needs of the area, and who will take pride in contributing to their own community would be an ideal fit. Both Baxter Construction and Marmot Properties stand out as exceptional candidates for this project. Their involvement would play a pivotal role in revitalizing the Old Brewery District by bringing much-needed workforce housing and/or office space, thus infusing the area with new energy and life. I fully support either proposal and eagerly anticipate the positive changes and renewed activity that these developments will bring to downtown. Selling the 315 and 335 Record Street properties has the potential to significantly benefit our community, and I strongly endorse moving forward to make this new vision for 4th Street a reality.

Regarding item E.1, I fully support the ordinance to amend Title 8, Chapter 8.10 of the Reno Municipal Code to enhance safety along our downtown rail corridors. Trespassing and loitering on or near the railroad tracks present significant public and life safety concerns, not only for the individuals involved but also for rail operators. Trains cannot stop quickly enough to avoid collisions with individuals or personal property left on the tracks. Keeping our rail corridors clear is a critical safety measure that will protect our city's ability to use our railroad systems for freight transportation and safeguard our vulnerable populations from the many risks associated with trespassing in active railroad areas.

Thank you for your attention to these important matters. I appreciate the City's continued efforts to support the growth, revitalization and safety of our downtown Reno community.
