Let's look at Numbers

Financial Implications: The fiscal impact analysis performed by Ekay Economics (October 2020) indicates that the project is anticipated to generate a positive fiscal impact to the City. Net general fund revenue is estimated to be \$24.2 million with a street fund deficit of \$8 million over a 20 year period. The estimated surplus to the general fund exceeds the street fund deficit by \$16.2 million.

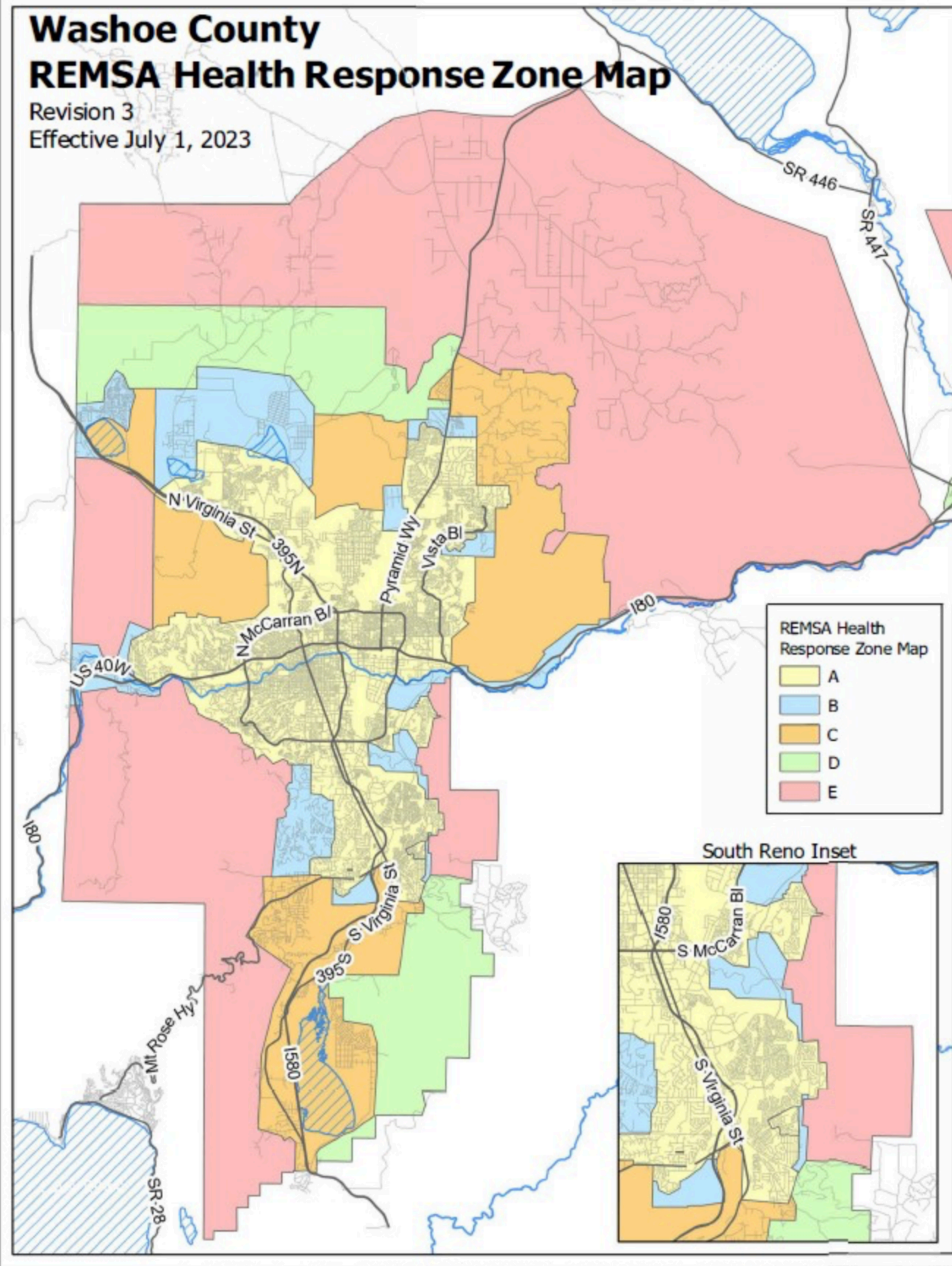
- This project will **GENERATE \$24.2 million dollars**
- From the 2025 City of Reno Budget
 - **Population 277,517**
 - Fire Dept Budget - \$72,759,200.00
 - TOTAL City of Reno Budget - \$299,022,180.00

More Numbers!

- In 2023, 60% or over 30,000 calls for the City of Reno Fire Department were for Medical calls
- Reno Fire Department response times for these UNBUILT areas are VERY optimistic best guesses
- There is **NO Automatic Aid** *between Truckee Meadows & Reno Fire for Medical calls*

REMSA Health Response Zones

REMSA Health, a non-profit private ambulance company, provides ground ambulance transport for City of Sparks, City of Reno, and the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District service areas. This map illustrates the designated response expectations for presumptively defined life-threatening calls (Priority 1 calls) within those service areas. This is also known as the REMSA Health Franchise Response Zones. Each zone (A-E) corresponds to a different time for expected response. These response times are as follows:

- Zone A – eight (8) minutes and fifty-nine (59) second or less
- Zone B – fifteen (15) minutes and fifty-nine (59) seconds or less
- Zone C – twenty (20) minutes and fifty-nine (59) seconds or less
- Zone D - thirty (30) minutes and fifty-nine (59) seconds or less
- Zone E – as quickly as possible

Prognosis for Cardiac Arrest Survivors

Survival after a [cardiac arrest](#) is dependent on many factors.

Factors before cardiac arrest:

- Age
- Ethnicity
- Poor health including diabetes, cancer, infection, kidney disease and stroke

Factors during cardiac arrest:

- Time between collapse and start of CPR/defibrillation
- Quality of CPR/defibrillation
- Whether survivor had neurological function during or immediately after CPR
