Members of the Council:

I would like to know why Reno Direct has removed the "Vacation House Check" from its list of services. This service provides an important level of security and peace of mind to the citizens of Reno who travel or are away from their home for an extended time. Considering the recent reports of squatters throughout the country trespassing and taking over non-occupied houses, this service has increased its importance dramatically.

For members who are not familiar with this service, I'll explain. After requesting a "Vacation House Check" through Reno Direct, the service request is assigned to Reno's S.A.V.E. (Senior Auxiliary Volunteer Effort) unit. During routine patrols, a patrol will periodically drive by the house looking for any suspicious activity. If none is seen, the patrol will check the house for unlocked doors, windows or other signs of suspicious activity. If anything suspicious is found, the S.A.V.E. unit reports to Dispatch who notifies RPD.

Again, I am requesting to know why the "Vacation House Check" service has been removed from the Reno Direct list of services and whether this decision is permanent.

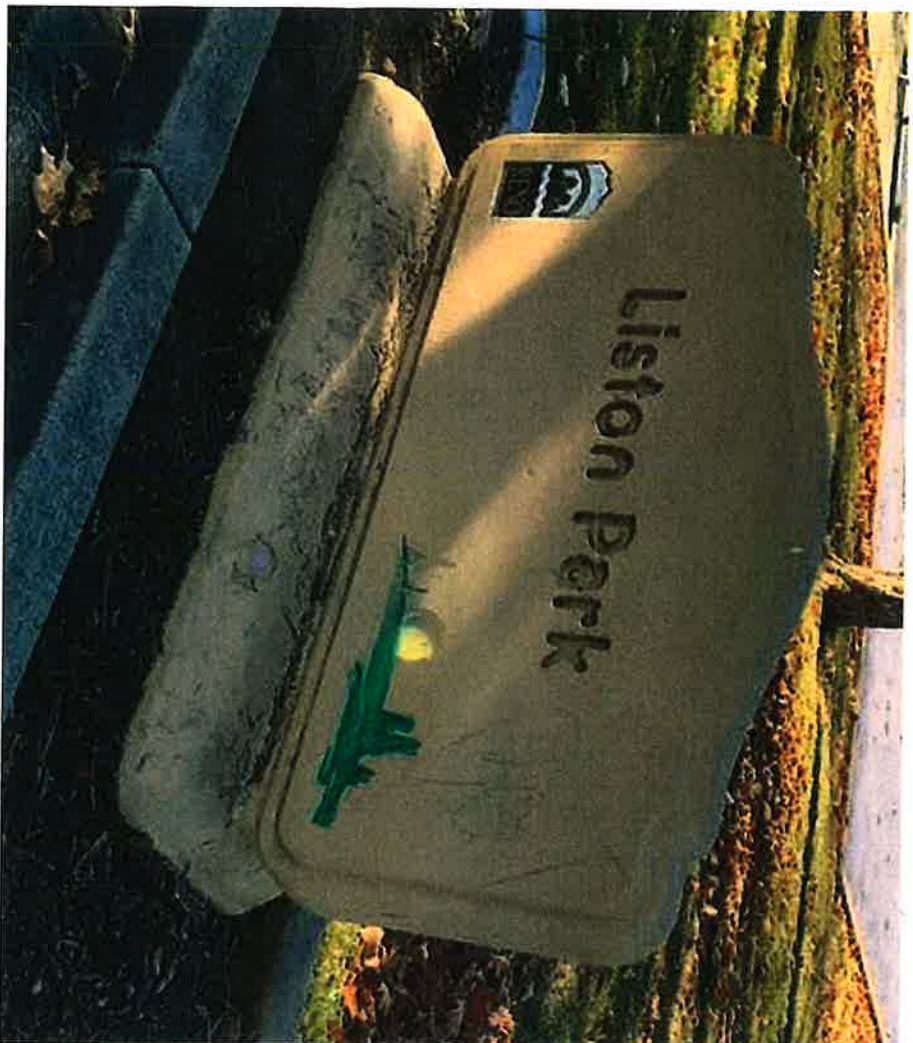

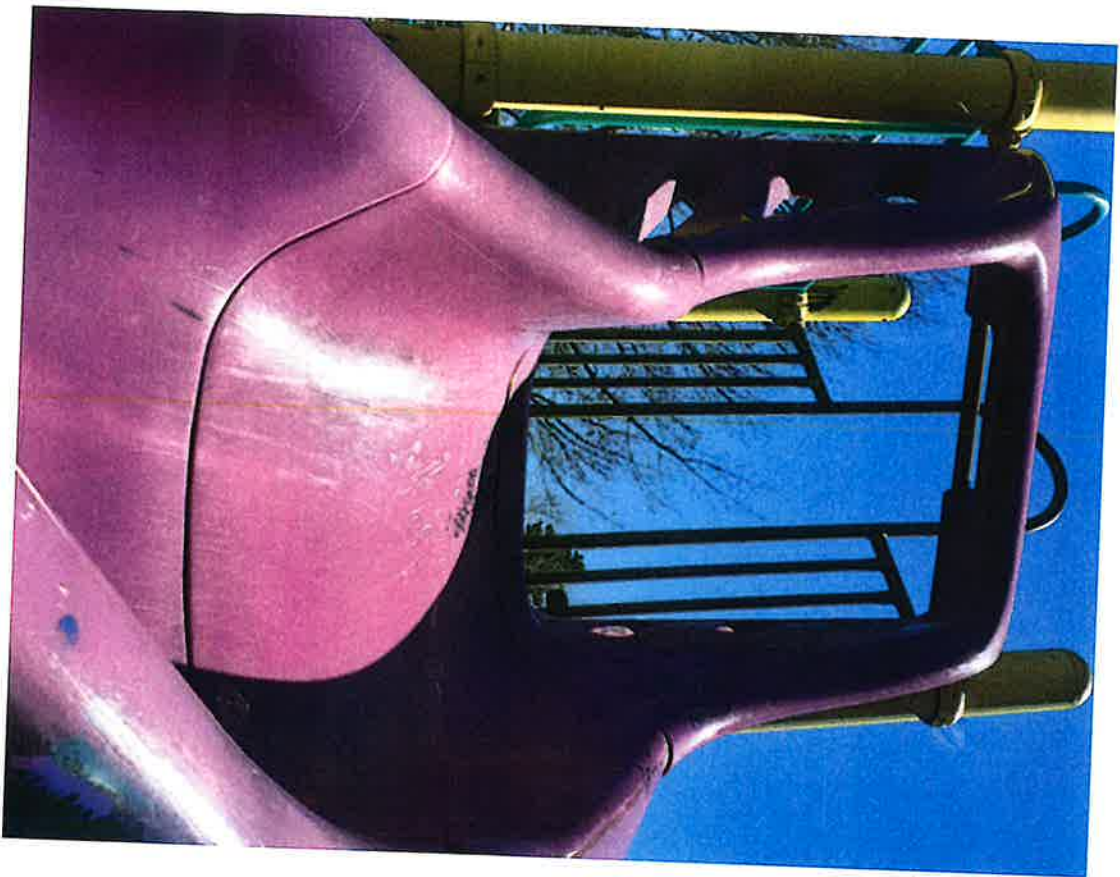
Liston Park on Yori Ave.

- 2. May 2023 – Submitted Reno Direct a Service Request #SER0006324 and #SER0029973 that included pictures of broken equipment. The case was closed because the Parks Department claimed the parts were on order with a 6 month lead time.**
- 3. December 2023 - I called to speak to my councilman and was assured a message would be sent to him and again complained about the equipment.**
- 4. December 2023 - Asked Joe Hart on KRNV News 4 to help. He was told nothing happened because the wrong park on Yori Ave. was inspected and no problems were found. But they would order equipment with a 6 month lead time.**
- 5. April 2024 – Almost a year later and the equipment is still broken.**

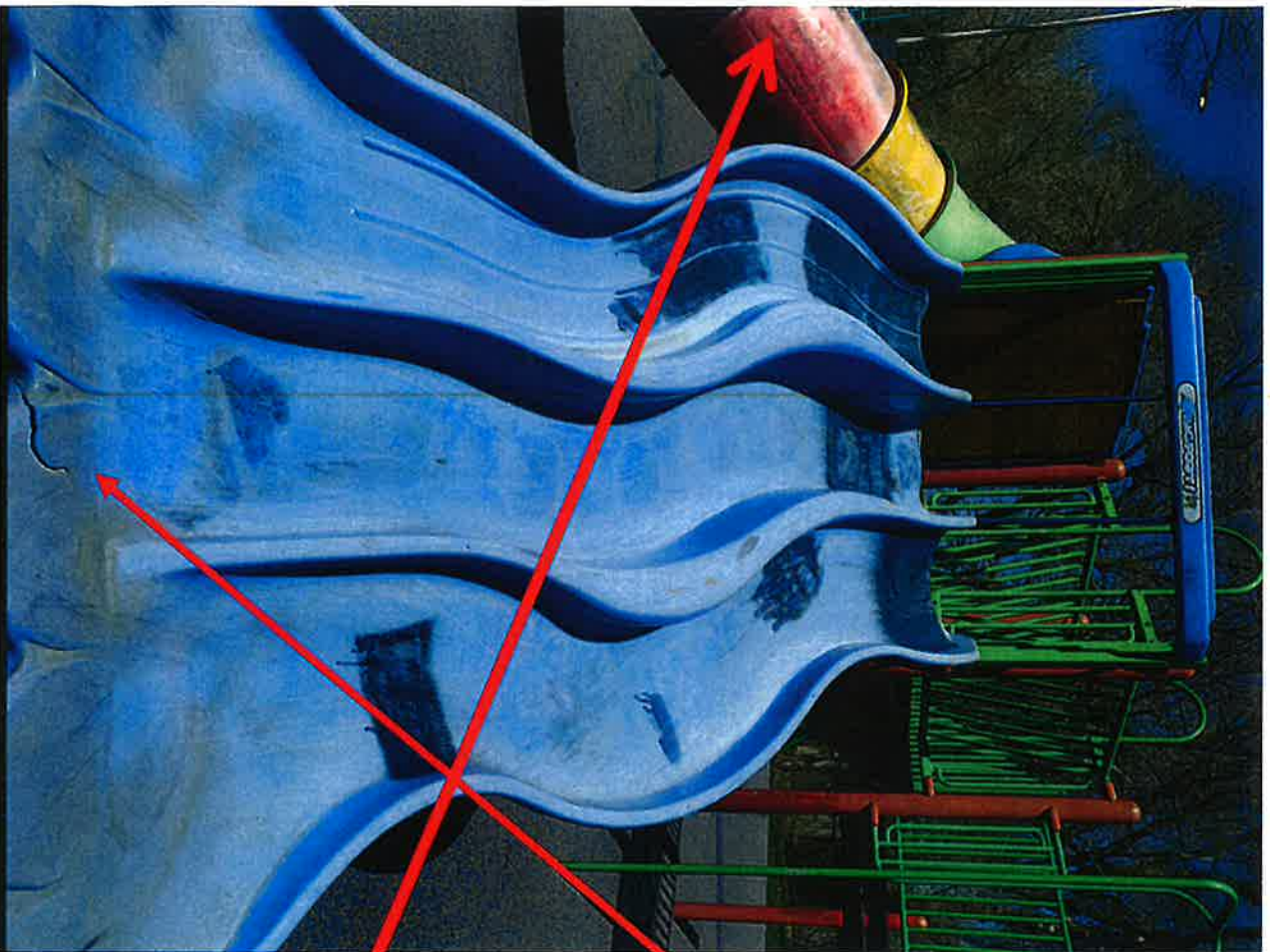

For the record; Art Rangel 255 N. Sierra St. I want to speak to items D.1, D.3 and D.4

I support the points Mr. Ceil brought up. As a city council, you receive many requests, all of which cost taxpayer dollars. The items Mr. Ceil brought up are no exception. The difference is that there are two funding sources available for downtown Reno that do not exist in most other parts of the city. We, as downtown homeowners, pay into the downtown business improvement district. In addition, our residential housing units are also within the Reno Redevelopment Project area 1. The boundaries of the Downtown BID are almost identical to the boundaries of the Downtown Reno Redevelopment Project Area. Both the BID and the redevelopment agency have very similar objectives, which is to improve things within their respective boundaries. In fact, State law requires that money generated from the BID special assessments as well as tax increment generated within the redevelopment project area be spent to benefit those areas.

Property values took a big hit in downtown Reno during the great recession but now values are on the upswing and both the BID and the downtown redevelopment area will benefit substantially in coming years. I will give you one example. We are all familiar with **Saint Thomas Cathedral** @ the corner of Arlington and 2nd. For years there was a vacant surface parking lot adjacent to the church. The County Assessor's office shows that in FY 21-22 while that parcel was still a surface parking lot it was valued at **\$377,300**. For FY 24-25 it is valued at **\$14,253,686** because it is now improved with a **five story, 69-unit** apartment complex. That is a factor of **37.8 times the original value**. And most of that additional value, based on the tax rate, is required to be spent to improve the downtown redevelopment area.

With all the vacant properties in downtown Reno there should be a significant amount of tax increment and new property tax to the BID in coming years to be spent on improving our downtown area. There are a lot of other vacant and/or underutilized properties in the downtown Redevelopment Project Area. When those properties develop, tax increment as well as money flowing to the downtown BID will be significant. The beauty is that that money must be spent to improve downtown.

In closing, I want to say that now is the time to honor our request because we know the funding will be there in coming years to support them and even expand them. One last thing, I hope the Reno Redevelopment Agency and the downtown BID will work together to make downtown safer, more livable for residents, attract high paying jobs and attract complimentary uses in downtown as well as encouraging tax increment generating developments over the years.

As a resident in Somerset for the past four years, living in the Cliff's development by Toll Brothers, I would like some further clarification as to the parameters by which you hold big developers accountable. It is my understanding that Toll Brothers had to provide a \$2.0+ million dollar performance bond as collateral so that they would revegetate hillsides and public spaces, stabilizing erosion, beautifying the hillsides as originally detailed and approved on the original engineered plans. This has not been accomplished to date. It is also my understanding that the City of Reno has released these bonds and Toll Brothers of their obligations to perform the work. Why was this allowed? Who authorized the release of this bond? What inspections took place and what were the parameters of the release given? Who holds Toll Brothers accountable? It appears they have no accountability to follow and complete the original engineered commitments. Is this lack of accountability also occurring in the other Toll Brother developments in Reno? Is Toll Brothers, a multi-billion dollar company, the tail wagging the dog?

I completely understand the desire of the city to build more houses for the tax revenue but how much of that revenue is lost completing projects the developer was originally responsible for? In the case of residences in the Cliffs development, will we be assessed a special HOA fee to cover the issues that Toll Brothers was required to complete under the original development plan? Why should the Cliff's homeowners have to pay additional assessments for items that should have been completed by Toll Brothers?

Let me give you a small example of erosion in the neighborhood. We have a small hillside behind our house with a culvert between the hillside and our backyard/patio. I had a 6:00 am departure for a flight out of Reno and it had rained heavily all night. Before I left, I thought I should check the backyard and what did I find? The culvert was completely backed up from the dirt/mud coming down the hillside and the water was encroaching into our backyard and patio.

In a dress shirt and slacks, I proceeded to put on snow boots, get two shovels and clear enough of the culvert to negate our home becoming flooded. With the Lord's help, I did make the flight and reported the issue to Toll Brothers on my return. Their answer to my predicament was "I'll see our guys keep the culvert clean". What about fixing the hillside erosion? That's the problem!!

Our hillside erosion issue is nothing compared to the other hillsides in the Cliffs development. I would not want to be the owner of a two story "walk out" home here in the Cliffs. With the changing environment we are experiencing in Reno and western Nevada we could be setting ourselves up for a major disaster as a result of poor risk management ending up like the condo collapse in Surfside, Florida.

When we purchased our home from Toll Brothers we elected to pay a significant premium for our lot as it has an open space to our east. This space has been used as a staging area, dumping ground, cement truck cleanout and port-a-potty landing area rather than a park-like setting shown in Toll Brother's marketing brochures. They attempted to hydro seed this area twice, once while we were gone. Upon our return, there was more hydroseed on the side of our house than in the lot. I brought this to the attention of Toll Brothers construction manager, and he said they would clean the side of our house. I declined their offer as I didn't want to hassle them when they would also probably then take stucco off the side of the house in their attempt to clean it.

Toll Brothers must be held accountable to meet the engineered plans and specifications as detailed on their subdivision development bond. There are many other issues homeowners have regarding the quality of workmanship with their multi-million dollar homes constructed by Toll Brothers that do not meet code. Other homeowners in the community may have or will address these issues separately but we need the City of Reno to do their job of holding the builder, in this case Toll Brothers, accountable for meeting the building codes for construction of new homes.

Thank you for your time, consideration, and follow-up on these matters.

RE: Toll Brothers "Cliffs" Development in Somerset.

Dear City Council Members,

Toll Brothers is nearing completion of their homes in the Cliffs subdivision of Somerset and intends to transfer some 46+ acres of highly graded and cut hillsides to homeowners of the Somerset Homeowners Association ("Association"). These areas are seriously deficient in slope stabilization and erosion control and remain unfinished and out of compliance with the City's Civil Improvement Plans which specify the requirements and obligations of the developer. If this area is transferred to homeowners in the Association without completion to the plans, the developer's responsibility to complete this work may be improperly transferred to homeowners, with substantial cost and risks to those homeowners. Effectively this allows for the builder to abandon their responsibilities and enjoy enhanced profits at the expense of innocent parties. It also misrepresents their intentions and promises made to homeowners to entice the purchase in this neighborhood, and when abandoned prematurely those areas will never look like what was represented or specified in the City permitted plans.

To protect the community and ensure Developers don't abandon their responsibilities the City of Reno, requires performance bonds of a builder, which are released once the work has been verified as properly completed. In the case of the Cliffs neighborhood, there were three landscape performance bonds covering this work, which totaled over \$418,000. To date, the City of Reno has released all but \$45,926, even though much the work has never been completed and was never independently verified.

Incredibly, the City relied solely on a stamped letter by Toll Brother's own landscape architect. No landscape standards were used, and there was no adherence to the requirements of the City's Civil Improvement Plans which defined the work to be completed. No independent third party was consulted before releasing these bonds, and it appears the City's inspection/engineering personnel did not physically verify the work was ever complete! In fact, the City appears to have reduced the process to a "checking the box" with no verification whether the information provided by the Developer is truthful, accurate, or complete, thereby leaving community members vulnerable to Developers who are otherwise free to put profit before performance standards. It is the City's responsibility to protect homeowners from these situations.

If this is the City's process of releasing Bonds, it is wholly inadequate for upholding the very reason the bonds are required.

As part of our due diligence, the Somerset Owners Association, who will be forced to accept the transfer of these areas, hired a Professional Civil Engineering company to inspect these areas to verify compliance with the city plans as well as other deficiencies. (Attached hereto as Attachment A.) This report includes a substantial list of shortcomings, many of which are deficient to the City's Civil Improvement Plans. Those items should have been complete prior to the release of landscape performance bonds. The major issues pertain to the partial or complete lack of re-vegetation of graded hillside slopes, without which those areas are subject to erosion, sloughing of material, and movement. An essential requirement also required under City Permitted Engineering plans is the installation of irrigation which must be employed and maintained for a minimum period of two years after re-seeding to allow for the germination and established growth of ground covers. Most of these slopes have no irrigation, essential for re-growth.

When releasing the performance bonds, the City of Reno relied on dubious assumptions in a letter supplied solely by Toll Brother's exclusive contractor. If one compares SOA's report of the actual site, the inaccuracies by Toll's landscape architect become blatantly obvious.

Case in point: The letter which caused the city to release landscape bonds specifically stated that the graded areas were stabilized for erosion further assuming that irrigation would not be required for successful revegetation. The City partially released bonds 2020 and again in 2023. As a reality check, below are pictures of these slopes in October of 2021 showing no re-vegetation, the complete lack of irrigation, and the resulting hillside erosion after a rain event. Had the City ever visited for a site inspection prior to bond release they would have witness this:



The slopes in these photos are five years after the grading took place, and any re-growth that might have taken place, if viable, would have already occurred. Instead, Toll Brothers relied on straw waddles which can be seen here as ineffective at preventing erosion. From these photos one can see not only the resulting erosion, but the lack of revegetation and the missing irrigation on these areas. After this rain event, Toll Brothers followed up with remedial cleanup and landscape netting, but even today lacks required re-vegetation or adherence to City's Civil Improvement Plans.

Additionally in the City's Civil Improvement Plans (by Odyssey Engineering) there is a requirement for the slopes: "Talus Slopes shall be graded with undulating appearance to break up solid looking engineered slopes, including mounting and pockets of native boulders." Nearly all slopes lack this feature, again as evidenced by the photos above.

The roughly 8,000 homeowners of Somerset Owners Association will suffer inequitable damages should this area be forcefully transferred to the homeowners. It is incomplete by the builder; the slopes risk destabilization, the homeowners are at risk for damages to property and life. Therefore, on behalf of all the homeowners of Somerset, the SOA hereby request the following from the City or Reno:

1. The City shall not release the remaining performance bond on this project, which purportedly has \$45,926.18 retained until all items included in the Heartfelt Engineering report (dated February, 2024) are completed in accordance with the City's Civil Improvement Plans, as verified on site by City inspection in conjunction with the approval of the SOA. We would expect the City will consult the SOA during this inspection process, since the SOA's residents will be the eventual beneficiary and owner of this property.
2. The City shall review its procedures and processes for the release of builder bonds to at least include independent evaluation and or inspection of performance items covered in the bond. The city should not continue to rely solely on statements made by the bond holder or their beholden consultants as the only source of information.
3. The attached Public Records Request under NRS 239 is hereby submitted requesting communications by and between City officials, elected, administrative, and appointed, and Toll Brothers including their engineers and contractors, related to the release of the landscape bonds .

Thank you for your attention to this important matter.

Project and Site Description

"The Cliffs" Subdivision is a subdivision located within the Somerset community. It has been under construction for many years, with many residents living there already, and construction of the remaining houses currently occurring at the time of my site visit.

The study area was all open space and roadways associated with "The Cliffs" Subdivision. Roadways identified as part of the "The Cliffs" Subdivision are identified as Graycliff Lane, Wild Skies Way, Crossbridge Way, Iron Sky Ct, Iron Sky Trl, Sun creek Trl, Sun creek Ct, Hillsborough St, Cold Creek Trl, and Hawk Meadow Trl. Open space areas are identified as Washoe County APNs 234-700-11 and 234-700-09. An overview of "The Cliffs" can be seen below in Figure 1. An overview of APNs 234-700-11 and 234-700-09 can be seen in Figures 2 and 3 on the following pages.

Site Visit and Visual Inspection of Open Space Areas and Roadways

A site visit was performed on May 11, 2023 to document and visually inspect the roadways and open space associated with "The Cliffs" Subdivision (as shown in Figure 1). All areas were manually walked. Any areas of concern, observations, or potential issues or hazards are to follow in their respective section. This report is designed to be easy to follow, and can be considered an informal "punch list" for the areas that could be improved. All photos will be identified through review of the overview guide shown in Figure 5 (Page 8). Figure 5 is an overview map and should be consulted for an approximate location for any comments or recommendations. A summary recommendation and conclusion section is found at the end of this report.

It should be noted that during the last site visit, there were significant areas and expanses of hillsides which were either not seeded at all, or required re-seeding / re-vegetation to prevent erosion. Based on the previous study performed in 2021 there has been significant areas of improvement, particularly along Hawk Meadow Trl; however, many areas seem to have gone unaddressed. For an overview of observed seeding / re-vegetation areas and recommendations, refer to Figure 4 on the following page.

- There was a major improvement in some areas, particularly along Hawk Meadow Trl versus the 2019 site visit; however, some areas remain unchanged from the 2019 field visit.

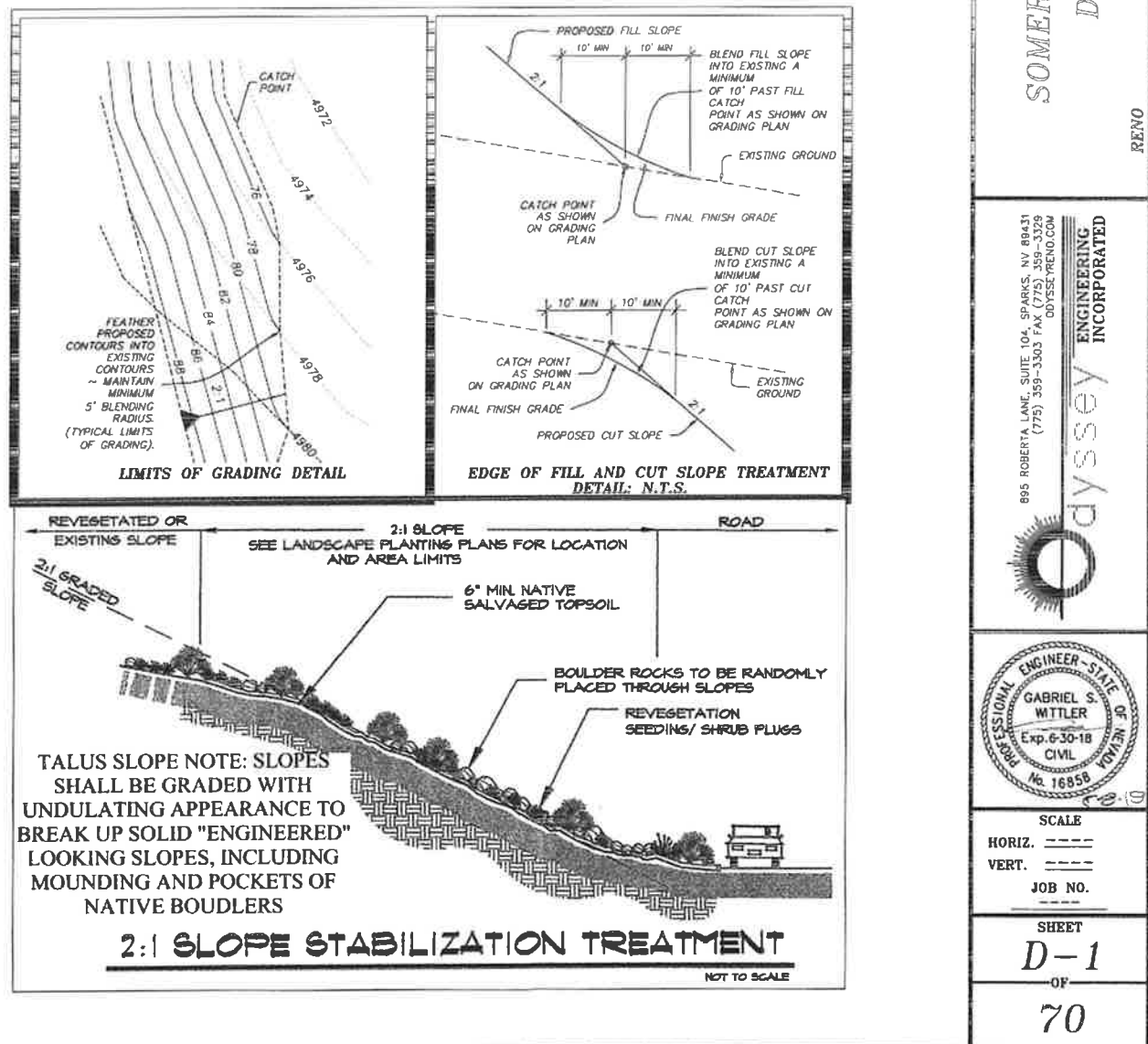
Figure 10 – Unsatisfactory Re-seeding / Revegetation Efforts North of Graycliff Ln.

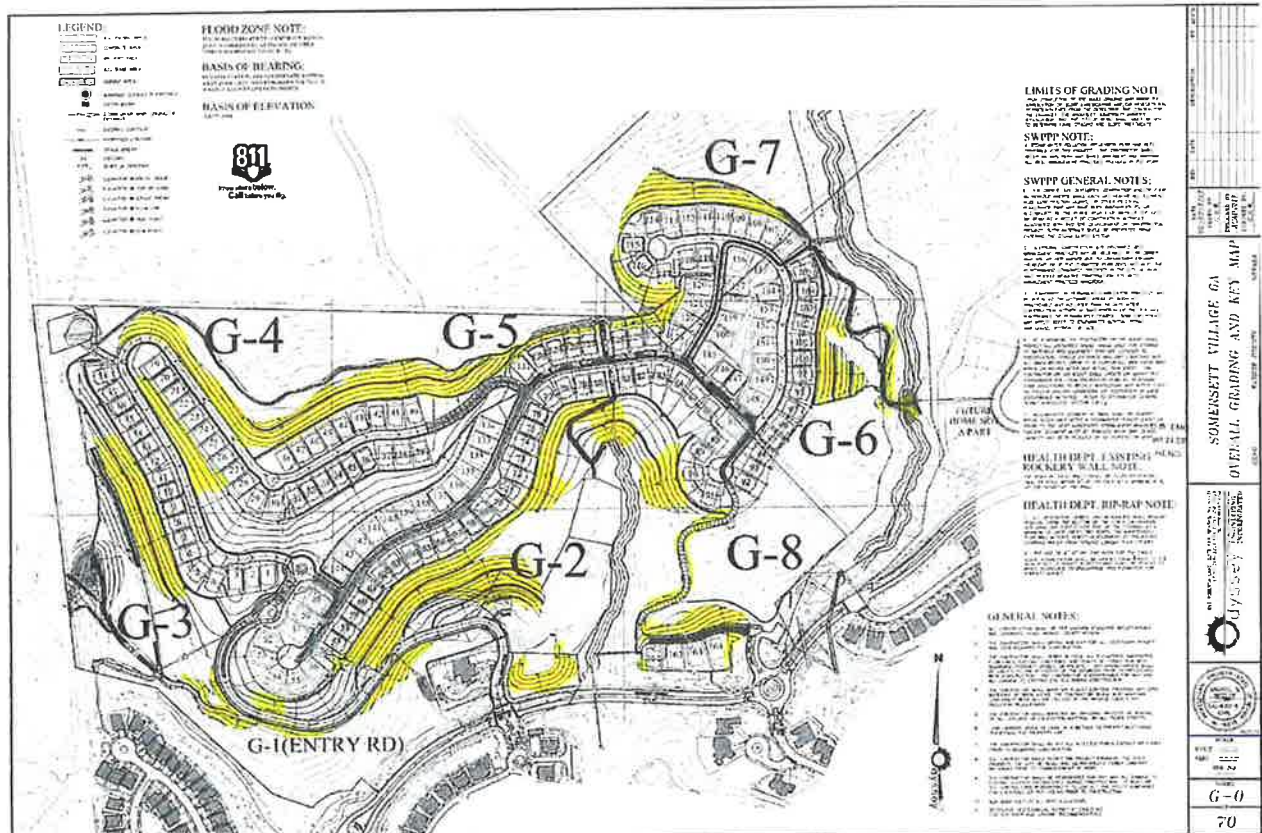


Figure 15 – Here is a map from the approved Engineering Grading Plan Set (Sheet G-0 of 70 for Approved Stamped Plans by Odyssey Engineering). All areas of the above image (highlighted yellow) are identified areas of 2:1 slopes per the Original Stamped Plan Set (locations were identified through review of Sheets G-2 through G-8). Note that the only place in which this detail appears to be followed is on the hillside north of Hawk Meadow Trail. No where else in the subdivision is this detail followed. Therefore, the majority of open space does not conform to the plans as designed.

Item "2" – Entrance to "The Cliffs"

Comments regarding this area:

- Chipped areas on concrete pillars identified in the 2019 report have been covered with attractive steel coverings (Items 7 and 8 of 2019 Report).
- Damaged curb area has been replaced with new curb and gutter; however, the new curb and gutter is already chipped and damaged. Recommend pulling special inspection records for this batch of concrete to make sure it meets specifications as it should not be damaged already. Curb may need to be removed and replaced with adequate curb and gutter. If saw-cutting curb and gutter, appropriate expansion joint should be placed between old and new curb and gutter.

A long term fix for this section would be to remove section and replace asphalt section with hot mix asphalt at the very end of construction activities. Due to mobilization costs it would be prudent to fix this spot in the future when other hot mix repairs paving is occurring in the area.
- Damaged curb portions should be sawcut, replaced, and fitted with Expansion Joint between new and old sections of concrete curb.

Item "13" – Curb Along Blue Pinion Dr

Comments regarding this area:

- Red painted curb along Blue Pinion Drive is peeling / failing. This entire fire lane in this area should be re-stripred red with appropriate striping paint.

Item "14" – Open Space between the Corner of Wild Skies Way / Graycliff Ln

Comments regarding this area:

- Damaged Sidewalk Curb at Corner of Wild Skies Way and Graycliff Ln should be replaced.
- Erosion Issues have been identified along the length of this open space. Concrete Valley Gutters are filled with both sediment and trash debris, both of which should be cleared.
- Lack of proper re-seeding / revegetation efforts since the 2019 report have caused erosion issues to occur.

Item "15" – Valley Gutter North of Graycliff Ln

Comments regarding this area:

- Valley Gutter is cracked and beginning to fail in the
- open space, north of Graycliff Ln. This less than ideal, but the valley gutter will likely continue to work as intended with the cracks.
- Recommend initial valley gutter failure is monitored.

Updated January 25, 2024 Site Visit and Visual Inspection of Open Space Areas and Roadways

A secondary site visit was performed on January 25, 2024 to document and visually re-inspect previously identified problem areas associated with the roadways and open space associated with "The Cliffs" Subdivision (as shown in Figure 1). Note that a secondary site visit was performed on January 25, 2024. While not every item was revisited and checked again, the large items (particularly review of open space areas and erosion issues) were revisited and documented. Aside from the filling in of the open saw cut at the start of Blue Pinon Drive with temporary cold patch (Figures 32 through 34 on pages 29 and 30), no changes or improvements were observed to the condition of open space and roadways since the May 11, 2023 site visit.

Conclusions & Recommendations

There are multiple items and which should be addressed. Items range from more minor concerns to potential safety hazards. Please review this report in its entirety for all items, comments, areas of concern, hazards, or recommendations. However, the largest areas of concern are any areas of concern for safety or property damage. Primarily the largest items for concern are:

- **Lack of Proper Revegetation / Re-seeding has led to initial erosion issues. These areas will only worsen if not addressed.**
- **Pursuant to Detail D-1 from Odyssey Engineering Plans for "The Cliffs" (Shown in Figure 14 of this report), the 2:1 Slope Stabilization Treatment Detail appears to not be followed except for the slopes directly above Hawk Meadow Trail. All other hillsides and 2:1 Slope Areas (Areas of 2:1 Slope Shown in Figure 15 of this Report) appear to completely ignore this detail, and therefore the majority of open space areas are not in conformance with the approved plans.**
- **Failing Red Striping in Fire Lanes might lead to drivers parking in Fire Lane.**
- **Open Sawcut in Blue Pinion Dr is a Severe Hazard (Especially to Pedestrians) and must be fixed**

Our observations, recommendations and conclusions in this report are strictly based from a site visit and visual inspection of roadway areas. No in-depth engineering analysis or testing has been performed.

It is recommended that this report is read in its entirety for all areas of concerns and recommendations.

All paint used for roadway and stop bar striping shall be specified "Traffic Striping Paint" or have manufacturer's certification of suitable application on asphaltic or concrete surfaces. Typically, two coats are minimum, as well as a minimum thickness of 15 mils for new striping applications.

OFFER - PUT CAC
UP FOR RFP

Discovering that, over the past year, while we have been regularly coming here and essentially begging Council to agendize a discussion on the future of the CAC, staff has actually been working on a backroom deal with a private developer all along – I feel heartbroken, to be honest, and hurt. We have been asking, in good faith, to be part of this conversation and you have shut the public out completely. An offer like the one Bash has submitted does not come together overnight. Brianna Bullentini, a Bash partner in this proposal, was writing to the City, “I am waiting on Tesla to get back to me on their desired unit mix here” in July of 2023. But we seem to have missed a critical step – Council never adopted a resolution of any kind on the future of the CAC!

Selling a publicly-owned building like this is not a regular commercial transaction. Especially if the sale is below-market-value – which the proposed sale is – Council is required, statutorily, to determine that selling the property would be in the public’s best interest. And how, exactly, can they determine such a thing if they refuse to engage with the public on this very topic?

Fortunately, there are many compelling reasons to deny Bash Capital’s offer. Let’s start with their foundational premise: “Our attainable housing project targets individuals earning between \$20 and \$25 per hour, a demographic in urgent need of attainable housing solutions.” Is this true, is this demographic in ‘urgent need’ of housing? Say I earn that much and am looking for housing. Where can I go (specifically new or in-process construction)?

Seems like there are actually quite a few options – my need is seeming less urgent already. How about if I am on a fixed income, or a very low income, or have no income at all – maybe I lost my job or had an expensive medical procedure or got no-cause evicted (very common here in Reno) - I am in need of housing, and the word ‘urgent’ feels a bit more appropriate here – where can I go?

Brianna seems to be a bit confused in her proposal. That’s okay – we can forgive her – she has not actually been living in Reno for some time, as you can tell by these two now-long-since-closed 4th street business she included in her slide on “The Neighborhood.” Her hastily constructed slides that repeat, without citing any factual information whatsoever, that neither the City nor the County ‘have the funds’ to renovate the CAC or ‘reopen the shelter,’ are completely missing the point and, incidentally, ignorant of what advocates have been saying for years now: the CAC can and should become housing. And on this, Brianna is not wrong: Reno does need more housing. But the kind of housing we need is not millennial-playtime-rooftop-view nonsense. It’s intentional, low-barrier, actually affordable, transitional, supportive, helps-people-in-need housing. There are so many different directions a renewed CAC could take. Let’s actually talk about it. Please, forget about BASH – have an open conversation with us about what we can do with this unique and invaluable asset – at the very least, put it for an RFP.
