**Summary:**

On November 18, 2024, the Reno Arts and Culture Commission (RACC) reviewed the ranking and scoring done by the grants panel of 24 Arts & Culture Event Grant applications for calendar year 2025. The RACC recommended funding of 24 Arts and Culture Event Grants based on scoring in the amount of \$114,573. Staff recommends Council adoption of a Resolution and approval of the agreements to allocate \$114,573 to 24 nonprofit Arts and Culture organizations for purposes described below.

**Background:**

The Arts and Culture Event Grants reviewers met on November 6, 2024 to score and rank 24 Arts and Culture Event Grant applications. The City of Reno Arts & Culture Events Grants are awarded to arts and culture and non-arts nonprofit organizations for one-time arts and culture FREE events. The events funded by City of Reno Arts and Culture Event Grants may be anywhere within the Reno city limits and must be free and open to the general public. Events should be designed to attract the maximum number of people, as appropriate for the event and site. Funds may be used to support community festivals, special performances, exhibitions, concerts, workshops, and other events. Applicants can receive up to \$7,000 of eligible event costs and require a 10% cash match.

Each organization has signed an individual agreement and an Affirmation of Nonprofit status for the event. Copies of the standard agreements are attached. The University of Nevada, Reno's agreement includes slightly different language in a few sections to address their status as a State Agency and to disallow expenses such as staff salaries and facilities charges. The City Attorney's Office has approved the agreements and affirmation.

### **Discussion:**

This is an annual grants program undertaken by the RACC on behalf of the City. On November 18, 2024, the RACC reviewed the recommendation of the grants panelists who reviewed 24 grant applications. All of the grant applications were recommended for funding based on scoring.

These Arts and Culture Event Grants provide funding for organizations to produce free events that are open to the public so these events are more accessible to all. Additionally, four years ago, the RACC initiated inclusion, diversity, equity, and accessibility (IDEA) requirements into the grants in order to reach a larger constituent base by encouraging partnerships, innovative programming, and attracting new groups to apply in an effort to create a more equitable funding model.

### **Financial Implications:**

The Arts and Culture Event Grants in the amount of \$114,573 are included in the FY24/25 budget. \$64,000 comes from the General Fund as part of the City Manager's Office budget. The remaining \$50,573 comes from the Room Tax budget allocated to Arts and Culture.

**Legal Implications:**

Legal review completed for compliance with City procedures and Nevada law.

**Recommendation:**
