Hi Carter,

Sorry for the delay but wanted to provide a brief comment on the Starbucks Booth Street project listed below (LDC25-00042). It goes without saying that this Starbucks location would be a huge draw to both Reno High School students and staff as it would provide a convenient food and beverage service to the area for Reno HS. Although pedestrian activity from Reno HS to the project site will undoubtedly increase, the site's proximity to Foster Drive/Booth Street intersection reduces pedestrian safety concerns since it is fully signalized with striped ped crossings. It seems most Reno HS staff and students would utilize this intersection and related sidewalk infrastructure to access the project site due to the location of most Reno HS parking lots. However, Reno HS also has another parking lot located roughly 560 feet north of the intersection where it seems likely that people may want to cross Booth Street rather than walking south to the intersection. Our suggestion is to work with Reno City Engineering and the Applicant's traffic consultant to analyze whether a mid-block pedestrian crossing would be suitable across Booth Street adjacent to our north parking lot and whether this crossing may help to help alleviate any potential future incidents.
