


McCarran Blvd. Traffic Safety Update




All Crashes Managed by RPD in 2024 Along McCarran (Reno City Limits)

Focusing on preventing crashes, minimizing harm, and acknowledging human limitations.


WHY IT MATTERS?

*Aims to eliminate **fatal** and **serious injuries**, even when mistakes are made by road users.*



McCarran Improvement Recommendations

- 14 projects identified in the **2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)**
- FY24 Interlocal Cooperative Agreements with Reno & Sparks
 - Reno Limits: Plumb Ln to South Virginia St
 - Scope: Safety and operational improvements
 - Status: Preliminary design
 - Sparks Limits: El Rancho Dr to Rock Blvd
 - Scope: Safety & operational improvements
 - Status: Preliminary design
 - Construction funding still needs to be identified
 - \$10m in regional matching funds allocated to support projects



Nevada Advisory Committee on Traffic Safety

Annual Report Recommendations

Best practices for:

Reducing or preventing fatalities and injuries related to motor vehicle crashes on roadways in Nevada

Data on:

Motor vehicle crashes in Nevada resulting in fatalities or serious bodily injuries, including causes and prevention measures

Policies to:

Reduce or prevent deaths and injuries related to motor vehicle crashes on roadways in Nevada

NVACTS Traffic Safety Priorities

- Road Safety Cameras (Automated Traffic Enforcement)
- Road Safety Cameras in School Zones
- Higher Fines in School Zones
- Primary Seat Belt Law (PBL)
- Graduated Driver's License (GDL) Additions
- Yield to Stop
- Traffic Records
- Fostering DUI Intervention Programs
- Safe System Intersections
- Appropriate Speed Limits for All Road Users

Additional Next Steps

- Continued implementation of crash mitigation strategies including:
 - Targeted traffic enforcement
 - Distracted driving initiatives
 - Public safety campaigns
 - Predictive analysis with the use of RTIC for analytic-based enforcement
