Background:

Through "The Bridges Not Walls" 2023-2024 series, UNR’s Department of Gender, Race, and Identity connected campus and community by partnering local organizations with graduate students from the Activist Scholarship class. As a way to recognize and support partnerships between campus and community, each organization that the graduate students worked with is

receiving \$500 to go toward their collaborative work.

Graduate student Audrey Andrews interned in the City of Reno's Arts & Culture Department in the summer of 2023 and focused her work on cataloging existing historic markers within the City of Reno. Through this work, Andrews identified that many groups were underrepresented in the histories presented in the existing markers. In collaboration with staff, Andrews made recommendations for a historic marker policy and identified opportunities for new markers.
