**Summary:**

The City of Reno is a leader in providing adaptive recreation programs and services to persons with disabilities. For that reason, City of Reno applied for and received an adaptive equipment scholarship from 2LIV4 for an Extreme Motus All-Terrain Wheelchair (\$4,400) and Adaptive Training Academy (ATA) for adaptive functional fitness supplies (\$763.11). Staff recommends Council accept the equipment sponsorship in the amount of \$5,163.11.

**Discussion:**

2LIV4 is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit with a mission to empower the disability community to discover their something 2LIV4 by providing scholarships for adaptive adventures and equipment, and sharing impactful stories and resources. The City of Reno applied for and received an adaptive equipment scholarship from 2LIV4 for an Extreme Motus All-Terrain Wheelchair (\$4,400). This All-Terrain Wheelchair will be used during City of Reno camps, clinics, and available through our adaptive equipment rental program.

Adaptive Training Academy (ATA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit established in 2012 by adaptive fitness community leaders to provide a solution to the challenges people with disabilities face in attempting to train fitness and maintain healthy lives. Due to the success of the City of Reno's Fit but not Forgotten veteran fitness program and Military to the Mountain program, the City of Reno was awarded an equipment grant to purchase adaptive functional fitness supplies (\$763.11) to support these programs. In addition, City of Reno staff were provided complimentary access to ATA's Adaptive and Inclusive Trainer (AIT) Certificate Course.
