I am commenting in opposition to the adoption of Bill No. 7284 because it is cruel and inhumane. The city of Reno, like many American cities, is experiencing a housing crisis, and especially since covid, the homeless population is rapidly increasing. There are a multitude of contributors to this crisis, and the bill addresses none of them. Instead, this city would rather waste police resources by playing whack-a-mole with people sitting down. They don't have to be causing a disturbance. They don't even have to be awake to get uprooted and told to go somewhere else. The Fresno bill, which this bill imitates, was just as pointless. After four months and 300 arrests, only 15 chose to be taken to a homeless shelter. From an interview with a homeless man after the Fresno bill passed: "It's like I don't have any rights

anymore," the 59-year-old said. "I can't even walk in my own neighborhood. I can't even sit down. I can't even be alive." (Rancaño Dec. 28, 2024, NPR) We are told that this ordinance is necessary exactly because people are refusing shelter. The refusal of anyone experiencing homelessness to accept provided shelter is an indictment on our shelters. They are clearly inadequate to meet the needs of the community and should be expanded, both physically, and in the resources they provide. The optional rehabilitation service as opposed to jail for violation of this ordinance is also insulting. The ordinance presupposes that the unhoused are all drug addicts who could magically find affordable housing if their condition was relieved. In reality, the housing crisis is just that. If the city wants to bring down homelessness, it should work to lower the cost of living and not treat homeless people like rats.

The Children's Advocacy Alliance is an independent voice for Nevada's children advancing systemic change in the areas of early childhood education, children's health and child welfare. We achieve public policy wins through collaboration and collective impact within the community to ensure every child in Nevada thrives. We oppose these agenda items as they disproportionately harm the city's most vulnerable residents—***its children and families.***

Homelessness and housing instability expose children to long-term health and developmental risks, affecting not only their immediate safety and well-being but also their educational outcomes, emotional development, and future opportunities for success. These effects are **further compounded by criminalization**, which places already struggling families at risk of warrants, fines, and incarceration. For parents, this increases the likelihood of family separation and child welfare involvement—**76% of children in Nevada's child welfare system enter due to neglect, which can include a lack of shelter.** In Washoe County alone, **26% of children enter the child welfare system specifically due to homelessness.** Rather than stabilizing families, punitive measures push them further into crisis, perpetuating cycles of poverty and system involvement.

Rather than criminalizing homelessness, the city should focus on **preventive measures that support long-term stability and healthy child development.** Increasing access to affordable housing, mental health care, and essential services for families at risk of homelessness is not just a moral obligation—it is an evidence-based approach to creating a safer, healthier, and more thriving community.

We urge the Reno City Council to **reject punitive policies** that penalize individuals for their poverty and housing status. Instead we encourage you to invest in solutions that prioritize dignity, family preservation, and long-term stability. We are happy to collaborate in identifying solutions to support children and families and contributing to policies that support children, families, and the well-being of our community.

I am writing to oppose further anti-homeless legislation as proposed by the council. These proposed measures fail to address the root causes of homelessness, and instead, they criminalize poverty. They grant law enforcement the authority to penalize individuals simply for existing in public spaces, which does nothing to solve the underlying issues. Furthermore, I argue that the problematic individuals are already breaking existing laws and should be dealt with accordingly. We've seen in cities like Los Angeles and San Francisco that ordinances like these do not reduce homelessness. Instead, they displace vulnerable individuals, burden public resources, and lead to costly legal battles over their constitutionality. Moreover, these ordinances risk eroding the freedoms of ordinary, lawful residents,

such as those who might sit or rest in public areas, while granting police the power to enforce these laws unevenly. Across the country, such vague measures have led to disproportionate impacts on marginalized groups, including people of color, individuals with disabilities, and those experiencing homelessness. I was walking through the Capitol park in Sacramento not long ago and the prevalence of homeless there was much the same as it is here. However in Sacramento, in addition to banning sleeping, camping and lying down, they also banned things like keeping your belongings in public, plugging in your devices in public, using the trash cans, smoking, and unattended wheelchairs. This is all pointless legislation. If this council feels that the camping ban by the Truckee was a success, then I will respond that the prevalence of homeless in my neighborhood greatly increased on a timeline that directly correlates to the camping ban and any camp sweeps. Records on the Reno direct portal will corroborate this claim. Instead of criminalizing those who have nowhere else to go, the city council should be seeking input from those who have experienced homelessness themselves. Effective solutions often come from individuals who have lived through this struggle and understand its nuances in ways that policymakers and city leaders cannot. It is not our place to judge what it is like to exist in a condition we know so little about. Rather than working against these individuals and the organizations that support them, the city council should be collaborating with them, enabling their efforts, and amplifying their voices. The CARES Campus is a good thing but it is not a one-size-fits-all solution and it should not be touted as the primary solution to homelessness in Reno. Cities that have successfully reduced homelessness, like Salt Lake City and Houston, have embraced housing-first strategies paired with supportive services, including mental health care, substance abuse treatment, and job training. These approaches work because they prioritize stability and respect for individuals' dignity. By contrast, measures like these ordinances perpetuate cycles of displacement and hardship without addressing the root causes of homelessness. These ordinances will neither resolve homelessness nor create a safer Reno. Instead, they risk limiting the freedom of lawful residents and granting police the discretion to enforce these laws discriminatorily. I urge you to invest in compassionate, evidence-based solutions and work collaboratively with those offering real help to ensure that we uplift our community as a whole. If this ordinance were to be implemented, it would cost the city a lot of money. Employing cops and maintaining more jail space is not inexpensive. Based on a 2023 Washoe County Sheriff's Office annual report, it costs \$174 a day per inmate at the county jail, which does not include other costs often associated with arrest, such as sweeping encampments. One study in San Francisco found that providing permanent supportive housing to 51 elderly residents saved the public \$500,000 per year. A study in Charlotte, North Carolina, found that the city saved \$2.4 million over the course of a year after creating a Housing First program. Overall it has been estimated that on a national level, it costs taxpayers \$31,065 a year to criminalize a single person suffering from homelessness. While providing

supportive housing costs \$10,051 per year. Other cities have done this, and we know that it doesn't work. Criminalizing the houseless costs a lot of money and helps no one. A better solution would be to work on providing housing. Please vote no on agenda items F.1 and F.2. Additionally, the last time this ordinance was voted on, many of your constituents wrote in and made public comments in opposition, while very few made public comments in favor. I am writing to strongly urge you not to pass the agenda items that criminalize homelessness in Reno. Treating people who are unhoused as criminals does not address the root causes of homelessness. Instead, it exacerbates existing challenges for people who are already struggling for the convenience of business interests and lies about public safety. Across the country, housing prices and rent continue to climb beyond the reach of many people. When we criminalize homelessness, we fail to recognize that this crisis is driven in large part by economic forces and a lack of affordable housing, rather than by any deliberate choice to live on the streets or myths about mental illness and drug use (<https://homelessnesshousingproblem.com/>). When we incarcerate individuals experiencing

homelessness, the costs to the public often exceed what it would take to provide safe housing and supportive services. Jails and prisons are expensive to operate, and they come with substantial hidden costs such as court fees, legal expenses, and the long-term societal impact of institutionalizing people. Jailing vulnerable community members can lead to cycles of re-incarceration, deteriorating health outcomes, and, tragically, an increased risk of harm or exploitation. Plus, a criminal record (even for minor, non-violent offenses such as sleeping in public) can haunt a person both financially and socially. Employers often discriminate against job applicants with criminal histories, effectively shutting the door to stable employment for many who are trying to regain their footing. Without access to gainful employment, it becomes nearly impossible to save money, secure a rental, or regain self-sufficiency. By criminalizing homelessness, we are effectively creating a barrier to the very resources and opportunities that would help people escape homelessness. Instead of criminalizing homelessness, I encourage you to invest in proven solutions such as Housing First models and other affordable housing initiatives. Reno is not developing new, suitably located housing to meet the region's demand and it is causing a ballooning effect on rent prices. Rather than criminalizing homelessness, maybe we should investigate approaches that decriminalize housing development, such as removing parking minimums, increasing the density allowed by right, and funding affordable housing trust funds. Thank you for considering this perspective. I hope you will recognize that alleviating homelessness is a moral, social, and economic imperative, but that doing so does not involve criminalizing the people who are subjected to it. Hiding and criminalizing homelessness is a short-term, inhumane solution which only serves to hide the problem instead of facing it head-on with empathy and creativity.

For example, 70% of people experiencing homelessness report that legal barriers and criminal records make finding housing or employment significantly harder, exacerbating their challenges. A better solution would focus on addressing the underlying issues, like lack of affordable housing, mental health support, and job opportunities, to break the cycle of hardship and offer real paths to recovery. I urge the council to address this issue with compassion and to prioritize investment in public services that offer meaningful, long-term support. Expanding access to affordable housing, mental health care, and inclusive shelters is essential for effectively tackling this crisis. Evidence shows that housing-first programs can reduce chronic homelessness by up to 87%, while also generating significant cost savings through reduced reliance on emergency services and incarceration. By funding outreach programs and supportive housing initiatives, we can improve outcomes for unhoused individuals and build a more equitable and humane community. Agenda item F.1, and all of the proposed ordinances on homelessness for that matter, are misguided and flawed efforts that do not adequately address homelessness in our community. Instead of seeking to either alleviate the pains of homelessness - via better shelters, programs, and aid - or tackle homelessness at its source - via equitable and reasonable housing and economic policy - the proposed measures instead aim to make homelessness less visible with no regard to how this will impact our homeless neighbors. Specifically, the proposed policies as written will continually target and punish individuals who lack or cannot access the resources or knowledge to navigate their situation and do not provide an adequate way for such individuals to improve their situation. The Staff Report for this item, Bill No. 7284, vaguely mentions "encourag[ing encampment] inhabitants to accept other alternatives like shelters, drug treatment programs, and mental health facilities", yet anyone who works with the homeless can share how ineffective these "alternatives" can be, especially in our community, as these are often limited in space, woefully underfunded, or require people to relinquish their own freedom, possessions, and dignity. City of Grants Pass v. Johnson is given as a legal justification for these

ordinances, yet we cannot delude ourselves into thinking that just because something is legal, that it is appropriate or effective, yet alone ethical. Instead of focusing on the visible perception of homelessness, I implore the City to instead consider solutions that address the fundamental causes of homelessness - as laid out earlier in this comment - so that we can meaningfully and effectively address this issue. I understand this may be difficult and nebulous, but we as a City and community must seek to address issues to solve them, not to simply cover them up.

I am strongly in favor of this ordinance. For too long we have turned a blind eye to the problems caused by our homeless population in the name of "compassion" or "empathy". We will never have a healthy and vibrant downtown (or Midtown, or any other neighborhood) so long as it is not a place where people feel safe. Within the last couple of weeks, I've witnessed people who were "camping" who, without hesitation dropped their pants and urinated, in front of children. I've witnessed people who were "camping" randomly shout and threaten people who had done nothing to them except walk too close while passing by, as if the entire sidewalk were their own private space. I've witnessed people who were "camping" blocking doorways, blocking sidewalks, blocking park accesses, and even

blocking a driveway (in fairness, it appeared to be the driveway to an abandoned building, so they might not have been blocking access to anyone). I've seen people so brazen in their defiance of existing laws (and social norms) to even have fire pits set up. I especially appreciate that this proposed ordinance explicitly calls for law enforcement to offer to take those they are citing for violating it to a facility that provides social services for mental health, housing, and substance abuse treatment. The only disappointment I have with how the ordinance is that the city only encourages the Court to grant diversion or probation with condition that a rehabilitation program be completed, it would be much better if the City and Court could take that a step further and include mandatory inpatient treatment as a sentencing option. I want a city where it would be safe for my elementary age son could safely walk to his school downtown on his own or with friends, instead of having to drive him every day (that also means a lot of changes to our road safety, which is a discussion for another day). I want a city where my elderly mother can use the sidewalk without having to worry about whether or not her path is going to be blocked by someone sleeping, forcing her to step into the road to get around. I want a city where I can walk into the public library without having to walk through the overwhelming smell of urine and cigarettes. This ordinance is a step in the right direction. It isn't perfect, it won't solve the problems by itself, but it is at least a tool to improve things.

I am opposed to items F.1, F.2, and F.6 that would prohibit "sitting, lying," "camping," and "loitering" on public property. This is a clear effort to make existing in public space illegal and is targeted at legislating homeless persons out of existence. This a) doesn't work (people don't just disappear because you can't see them); and b) is extremely inhumane, given that our shelters are perennially full or near full and the spaces available can be dangerous. Even when there are available shelter beds, they're often unsafe and/or inaccessible for people with disabilities, women, couples, families, and people with pets. The sweeps and incarceration that would come from making publicly existing illegal would lead to more deaths, more overdoses, less stability, and less ability to seek and maintain access

to services. Furthermore, in addition to being inhumane, this proposed change is a waste of taxpayer dollars. Please tell the public WHY and HOW giving more money to police to remove and arrest people is in any way more effective than using funds to address the root causes of homelessness. A study in Charlotte, NC found that the city saved \$2.4 million over the course of a year after creating a Housing First program. Prior incarceration also creates barriers to jobs and housing that would allow people to get off the streets permanently, meaning this measure is just Reno shooting itself and its own most vulnerable in the foot. We could invest in developing affordable housing, making more social services and coinciding resources available, equipping warming and cooling centers, offering job training, really I can think of about 1000 things that would be more effective, if you actually want to help people not be homeless. The only thing this measure would achieve (temporarily) is to make more fortunate people think their town is "cleaner" or better off. We are all a community and we must help each other, not through the "detestables" in the trash. Thank you for your time and consideration on this urgent issue.

I am writing to oppose it F.1, F.2, and F.6. This bill essentially criminalizes being unhoused. Shelters are full, but being in one is unsafe and/or inaccessible for people with disabilities, women, couples, families, and people with pets. Sweeps and incarceration lead to more death, more overdoses, less stability, and less ability to seek and maintain access to services. The fact that these ordinances are morally abhorrent should be enough to oppose it. Unfortunately, it is not, but money is. Taxpayer dollars funding police and jails rather than address the root cause of this: housing access. A study in Charlotte, NC, found that in one year, the city saved \$2.4 million after implementing a Housing First program. Three months in jail costs the same as one year of supportive housing. Prior incarceration

creates barriers to jobs and housing that would allow people to stay off the streets. Frankly, this should never have been brought to the table.

This is clearly a law that will target the poor, and when applied to them will imprison them and make it more difficult for them to get hired in the future. This will create barriers for them to achieve a stable life and keep them on the streets. This will effectively criminalize their existence. Furthermore, it's likely this ordinance will be used to racially target non-white people for existing in public. By criminalizing such a ubiquitous behavior as sitting down in public, it gives the police carte blanche to arrest anyone almost anyone they like at any given moment. Regarding people who are "laying in public," they very often cannot go to a shelter because the shelters are almost always full. When there is room in a

shelter, it often isn't safe or accessible for vulnerable people like the disabled. Instead of wasting my tax money on more policing in an increasingly authoritarian state, it would be wiser to spend the money on programs that focus on housing access and addressing the root causes of homelessness. Making the homeless serve jail time is more costly in the end than providing supportive housing.

Formerly incarcerated people are nearly 10 times more likely to experience houslessness, and jailing, even short term, increases the likelihood a person will be incarcerated again. The fines and fees associated with jailing also make it difficult for a person who may not already be able to afford housing to be able to afford basic necessities. Incarceration can also cause lasting damage to mental health, including major depressive disorder and bipolar disorder,

Dear Members of the Reno City Council,

My name is Benjamin Zober. I am one of the rabbis at Temple Sinai in Reno and a member of the community. I wished to share some of my thoughts on item F.1, Ordinance Adoption - Bill No. 7284.

For as many as 25 years, Reno has had an ordinance that bans camping on public property. I would like to take a few moments to familiarize everyone with the contents of Sec. 8.12.030 and 8.23.090. The Reno City Council begins with a preamble, describing the Truckee River watershed and indicating its ecological role and aesthetic benefits to the community. The ordinance prohibits camping within 350 feet of the river's banks, within city limits.

It continues to define camping. Prohibited camping includes bedding down and preparing to bed down and using anything from a tent to a vehicle for sleeping. It also prohibits many activities related to camping such as use of propane grills contrary to manufacturer's instructions. The ordinance also provides a subjective test for what constitutes camping. There are also exceptions, including emergencies, commercial activities, festivals, and performances. Violators will be guilty of a misdemeanor. This is the most recent version of the ordinance.

It mentions over a century of decline, but makes no mention of the role human habitation had on that, as opposed to natural changes or industrial effects. The ordinance prohibits camping within 350 feet of the river's banks, within city limits. The document, without proof or evidence, claims that "limited regulation of camping within the Truckee River Corridor is reasonably necessary to protect and enhance the water quality or water resources of the Truckee River and appropriately balances the public interest and individual rights."

More recently, Sparks followed suit with an ordinance that is almost identical to the one in Reno. The latest amendments to that ordinance were voted on the same night that members of the faith community held a vigil for the 135 individuals in Reno who died unhoused, last year. I mention this not to pat myself on the back but to differentiate between responses. I would also mention that one supporter voting for the measure in Sparks indicated that those individuals died because we could not get them to the resources we need, and argued passing the ordinance would help, although Reno has had this ordinance for 25 years and the numbers have not abated, in fact they continue to climb.

These ordinances have 3 aims: to protect the river and the environment; to protect the beauty and aesthetics of the Truckee River Corridor, and to help get the unhoused to stable and safe housing. As to the first goal, a laudable and important one, the measure does little that has not already been done. Under the Reno Municipal Code and under the Nevada Revised Statutes, it is a misdemeanor to dump in non-designated areas, particularly, the river. As to the aesthetics of the area, there are truly beautiful parts along the river. There is also a casino, an airport, an autobody lot, and the storage facility for Waste Management's garbage cans. I struggle with the idea that it would be better to stare at garbage than a human being.

The City of Reno is proud not only of the natural beauty of the area, but of its use. The Reno/Tahoe tourism website advertises camping with the header: "SPEND SOME SERIOUS

TIME WITH MOTHER NATURE From the Sierra Nevada to the Black Rock Desert, camping opportunities are endless.” But that is not true. Campers and tents are welcome, celebrated even, but only when it is attractive to do so. Only when it is rich tourists or headline-friendly thrill seekers. Even in a place where trailers and campers are part of the culture, they are still being stigmatized because in this case, they are filled with poor people.

The final argument, that this measure will help people get to resources and safe places does not appear in the ordinance itself. Nothing, either in the preamble or elsewhere indicates this as a goal. Forcing people to take shelter or move under threat of punishment cannot be the least restrictive means of doing so. The Washoe County Ordinance followed quickly on the heels of the updated Sparks one. That argument, as was made by Sheriff Darrin Balaam, was that similar policies in Reno and Sparks were pushing people away from services. (KUNR) If the intent was to get people the resources they need, these measures would seem to have the opposite effect. The other implication was that Reno and Sparks would merely be pushing the problem onto county property. However, with 25 years of this ordinance on Reno’s books, it has neither run the unhoused out of the city, nor has it flooded Sparks or the county with displaced individuals.

It also has unintended consequences, namely criminalizing homelessness. The unhoused have a number of barriers that prevent them from obtaining stable housing. The lack of affordable housing is certainly the chief reason, but there are others. One of those is a criminal record. Even a misdemeanor can increase the difficulty in getting housing, not to mention that it costs money, money that most of these individuals do not have or can afford to lose. The fine for illegal camping can be as high as \$1000.

Making this a problem for law enforcement is not ideal for anyone, including the police. Craig Turner, Washoe County Sheriff’s Deputy, said that arresting everyone who violated the ordinance would damage the relationships he and his officers have spent the last 2 years building. Police abuses are a real problem in many communities. As we struggle to resolve this problem, removing causes for confrontation between police and the public would be a reasonable solution. Well-established relationships could also enable officers to guide people to better locations or resources, or better yet, trained professionals like social workers or counselors could do so, without the specter of guns, violence, or coercion and punishment.

According to KUNR, “Balaam said the camping ban was needed because similar policies in Reno and Sparks were pushing unhoused people away from services. His office plans to use the ordinance to direct them back to resources in the urban core, such as the county-run Nevada Cares Campus.” If Reno’s ordinance was pushing people away from services, it does not help them. And if we want to help them, then removing this barrier would seem the obvious path. It also bears mentioning that Sheriff Balaam’s statement refutes a key argument in implementation of these ordinances: that the threat or prospect of incarceration will encourage people to seek out other resources, whether shelters or ways of getting off of the streets.

The United States Supreme Court took up this issue. And while they have found no legal barriers to this sort of law, the moral question remains: what is the proper way to treat those

without stable housing? We should not abdicate our morals to the legal pronouncements of a court; what is legal is not always ethical. If this body is dedicated to social justice and human dignity, the legality of a particular statute or ordinance should prove no boundary when said legislation offends liberty.

At each opportunity, many people have offered their opinions on these measures. There have been statements from law enforcement, as indicated, and no shortage of religious leaders like myself. There is another demographic, whose voices should not be discounted, and perhaps should be elevated even more: those who are or were part of the unhoused community. I heard many of them speak at the recent meetings in Washoe County, and they attested to the personal cost these measures had on them and would have on others. They explained where the inadequacies of the shelters were and why those places, as beneficial as they are, do not always work to serve everyone.

Further, this ordinance and others like it, does stigmatize the unhoused. Cary Solferino, in testifying for the passage of one such ordinance explained, “That’s why we need the misdemeanor charge... We need that deterrent effect. We need that classification to give them something to hang over their head. To give these service resistant individuals the gentle nudge they need towards services.” I can assure you, the threat of incarceration is not a gentle nudge. Nor are police officers just “social workers with guns” as another indicated. Giving them the classification “to give them something to hang over their head” is a threat. And that threat carries with it the label of criminal. That does nothing to help them out of poverty or homelessness but it also often makes it worse. It makes homelessness a crime and makes poverty a punishment.

All of this brings up the question: what is the solution? A number of politicians who supported this ordinance seemed less convinced of it than as a “tool of last resort.” If this is truly the case, let’s get some other tools. Homelessness is a problem with an obvious solution: give people homes. If someone has a home, they are not homeless. Giving someone a home will not solve all of their problems, they may still struggle to find adequate employment, they may still have health issues, they may struggle interpersonally, or any number of other things that any of us could have in our lives. But once someone has a home, that is one less problem, and often enables them to address their other challenges. The most obvious of them is employment. When someone fills out an application for a job, they have to put down their address. Many applications are abandoned because people cannot answer that question. Others are submitted but rejected either because they are incomplete, or because of the stigma attached to homelessness.

I understand that we do not have empty and available homes that we can just give to everyone who needs them. The shortage of affordable housing goes beyond that. The media home price or rental price is well beyond most people in this area. Addressing the shortage of affordable housing would go a long way to addressing homelessness. If criminalizing does not even get people to shelters or other resources that might help them get out of homelessness, spending time and energy on ordinances like the one at hand is wasted energy. If our government spent time working to create real solutions, the need for keeping people from camping at the river would also decrease.

We can also adapt to accommodate what we already have. In some communities, they have addressed vehicular homelessness not by trying to push the cars out, but by making safe spaces for them. When the anti-camping ordinance came before the County Commissioners, Commissioner Garcia suggested a pilot program for safe parking. The United States has somewhere between 700,000 and 2 billion parking spaces. In commercial lots alone, there are 2 spaces for every registered vehicle. Some of this could go to private entities - WalMart used to welcome RVs, and some houses of worship have made their lots available as well. But it is not a reality for every faith community or house of worship to allow people to park on their property. It would be unfair and an abdication of the government's duty to care for its people to put this solely on volunteers from faith based organizations. Nor is it a reality for every public space to be opened up to encampments or overnight parking. There is a possibility for resolution somewhere in between. There is enough space for everyone.

It is also critical that we do not rest on our laurels for any of our actions. The CARES campus is a tremendous facility and does untold amounts of good in the community. But it has not solved the problem of homelessness. To hear some people talk though, it is the panacea we have all been waiting for. And yet, we still have laws banning camping. The CARES campus and many related organizations are temporary and partial ways of addressing this. What they can do is afford temporary and limited relief, hopefully giving the rest of the community an opportunity to determine the next step. I urge you to consider that anything that does not further the fight against poverty and homelessness is not a step in the right direction, and probably not a step at all.

To that end, when Washoe County passed its ordinance this year, Commissioner Hill indicated that she approved the measure with the intent of revisiting it in a year. If these ordinances are to remain in effect, we have to demand oversight and evaluation, as they are unequivocally a diminution of individual rights. Now that this is before the Reno City Council it must be acknowledged that this law has not yielded the intended results. Expansion of this law will only mean that the deleterious effects of the law will increase as well.

Criminalizing our houseless neighbors for simply existing in public spaces is morally wrong and does nothing to solve the growing housing crisis this city is facing. I do not want to see my taxes go towards funding the enforcement of these senseless ordinances for the following reasons: 1) These ordinances target our most vulnerable citizens who are simply trying to survive. 2) Three months in jail costs the same amount as one YEAR worth of supportive housing. 3) If the ultimate goal is to get our houseless neighbors off of our streets, then having an arrest record jeopardizes their ability to find employment which would ultimately allow them to find housing. 4) Shelters are often full, carry heavy stipulations, lack the appropriate resources,

or are simply unsafe. The city of Reno needs to invest in adequately supporting and maintaining shelters before blaming the unhoused for "refusing services". 5) Housing First WORKS. There are numerous studies from across the nation that prove that 75-90% of cases remain in stable housing after just 2 months of support.
