Short Description of the Work Throughout this region of Iowa and Wisconsin are found hundreds of carefully crafted mounds, tucked in the bluffs above the Mississippi River and taking on larger-than-life shapes of animals. These thousand plus old artifacts are known as Effigy Mounds. While the Effigy Mounds take on many animal shapes a very common one is a bird in flight. However an effigy, as typically described is a crude depiction of a hated person usually beaten publicly as a form of protest. By no means was that the intention of this early indigenous land art. On the contrary, these massive mounds were likely created in reverence to the natural world. Native Americans whose ancestors built the mounds describe them as ceremonial and sacred sites. Admiration Mounds. Only later were they named Effigy Mounds by European settlers perhaps at odds with a much older history. Although the reasoning behind these mounds is still clouded in mystery they remain a relic of an indigenous culture working together to express themselves through a monumental work of Art. This sentiment is all too familiar in my line of work and I hoped to tether the public art of now to the public art of our ancestors. If you hold a mirror up to another mirror you don't necessarily see farther but deeper. In Reverse Effigy, I combined familiar and historical pieces of the environment into a new tapestry punctuated by color. Painted from a bird's eye view, a Peregrine Falcon soars high above an effigy mound of luminous greens abstracted by softly spray painted Prairie Shootingstars, Showy Goldenrod, Echinacea, Milkweed, and Water Lilies. In the painting, the past and present, macro and micro, all merge. Pigments dance like stained glass without edges.

Title The Miss in Missing

Short Description of the Work Produced in conjunction with the annual Fandango and Pow Wow, hosted by the Ely Shoshone Tribe. The mural explores the ornate and varied patterns, textures, and colors in the regalia of a traditional jingle dancer, highlighted here in the state colors of silver and blue. The symmetry of the composition emanates from a lone drum behind the figure to mirror the rhythmic and layered sound of the Pow Wow. While she is decorated in beadwork, elk teeth, and jingles her most important adornment is her black and red bracelet with the word "Missing" to bring awareness to the staggering amount of Missing and Murdered Indigenous People. This mural was produced along with my daughter and I hope it can be medicine for all of our future generations.

Short Description of the Work Here with 13 shepherders that came to Elko directly from the Basque Country at varying times between 1950 and 1970. I had each one of these men paint their name on a tree just as they had carved it back when they were grazing their sheep for Elko ranchers. The tradition of arboglyphs amongst the Basque that relocated to this region of the US is vast and fascinating. Very happy for the local participation to create an authentic representation of the culture within this larger Basque-themed mural. I have so much appreciation to this generation of men and the large Basque community in Elko.

Letter of Interest

I have been fortunate enough to paint over 100 murals throughout Washoe County with the help of various individuals, private businesses, and community organizations. It seems impossible but this would only be the second time working with the City of Reno and the first time directly asking for their support.

I'm drawn to this project for several reasons. First off, I'm an alum of UNR and like so many I would often park and then make the walk from this area. Second, with over 20 years of mural experience I was a student and later instructor for Youth Art Works (who originally painted this mural) and although I wasn't part of this particular mural I've always felt a sense of stewardship to represent the highest caliber of work on behalf of YAW. Lastly, murals at parks and community centers sit on a higher podium for me. As a backdrop for kids and families I think they are more integral to inspiring and supporting the next generation of creatives which only benefits the future of our City.

Community engagement is often times a box to check for mural funding and I've seen it done well and not so well. Aside from having people slap hand prints on a wall or inundate a lead artist with disparate ideas to somehow collage together into a cohesive visual I would want to integrate as many people into the work as possible, by spreading their involvement out over several weeks and working daily with a new small group of 3. This mentorship would be able to directly involve them, pass authorship, and expand their artistic tool kits.

Like the content of many of my murals I treat the process like cooking. Before you have a recipe you get a sense of your ingredients. For this I would meet and listen to stakeholders and community members of the site to get a better sense of direction. This often is a springboard into deeper research, further meetings and interviews that I use to help navigate the design process. Once I have plenty of ingredients I tether the ones that compliment each other and put the others to the side. Since the mural faces Dick Taylor Park it only makes sense that these meetings would take place around the grills while breaking bread and sharing family recipes.
