Angela Fuss, City of Reno Development Services Assistant Director, answered questions from Council Member Duerr regarding requirements for the new use of data centers.

Council Member Duerr stated data centers are energy and water intensive and she would like to see special standards adopted for data centers, similar to other uses that have unique impacts.

Ms. Fuss answered questions from Council Member Duerr regarding the process to adopt special standards for data centers.

Council Member Ebert stated she is the liaison for the Reno Planning Commission and they are looking for City Council to give them more guidance on how data centers should be conditioned.

Mayor Schieve expressed concern that conditional use permits stay in place when a business is sold and the quality of operations may not stay as good with new owners. Maybe that is something we could look at.

Council Member Duerr stated that TMWA is starting to look more closely at high intensity water uses and having their board weigh in on the appropriateness of the use.

Council Member Ebert discussed the need to identify what we expect of data centers and asked about a potential moratorium on data centers until that is established.

City Manager Bryant explained that a moratorium on data centers would have to be brought back at a future meeting. With respect to the current item, it does contain information relative to data centers. Council Member Duerr's request for a text amendment to adopt special standards for data centers needs to be brought back as a separate item.

Council Member Ebert asked for more information on guidelines for data center development that will be going through with this ordinance.

Ms. Fuss reviewed the information included on standards for data centers. Data centers will require a conditional use permit so they will go through a public review process. That can be appealed to City Council where additional conditions can be included.
