

**RESOLUTION DONATING COUNCIL DISCRETIONARY FUNDS TO
THE TRUCKEE MEADOWS PARKS FOUNDATION IN SUPPORT OF
THE VIRGINIA RANGE TRAIL PROJECT IN THE AMOUNT OF
\$10,000. (GENERAL FUND)**

WHEREAS, the City of Reno may donate funds in accordance with NRS 268.028(01), entitled “Expenditure of public money; grant of public money and donation of certain property to certain nonprofit organizations or governmental entities” when such expenditure provides a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the City; and,

WHEREAS, Truckee Meadows Trails, in partnership with the Truckee Meadows Parks Foundation, is leading the Virginia Range Trail Project with the aim of determining the feasibility of developing a Virginia Range Open Space Corridor and establishing a trail system for recreational use; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed Virginia Range Trail System is envisioned to provide immediate trail access to multiple neighborhoods, enhance wildlife habitat, preserve critical open space, promote trail sustainability, and contribute to landscape restoration efforts in the Truckee Meadows area; and,

WHEREAS, the Reno City Council recognizes the importance of supporting projects that improve recreational opportunities, protect natural resources, and enhance the quality of life for residents; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Reno approves the Council donation from Councilmember Duerr in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to the Truckee Meadows Parks Foundation; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should the above donation or any portion thereof not be used for the purpose as set forth in this Resolution, any unused funds shall be returned to the City of Reno.
