What is a Gold Award?

- Capstone to Girl Scouting experience
- Create a project to address and make a lasting impact on an important issue in community
- Minimum 80 hours committed
- Educate impacted groups & report to National Council

Why did I choose this project?

- Lifeguard for COR 3 years
- Heard the question asked all the time:
 - “What if the victim is a woman?”
 - “How is this different on a woman?”
- Massive training disparity on female anatomy

- 71% of COR guards indicated they did not know how to do CPR on females



- 20% increase in comfortability after training

Statistics

- Women are 43% less likely to receive CPR*
- Leads to a 23% higher survival rate of men*
- The implications of these findings are profound, considering that cardiac arrest claims the lives of over 350,000 Americans annually outside of hospital settings.*

Boob Box

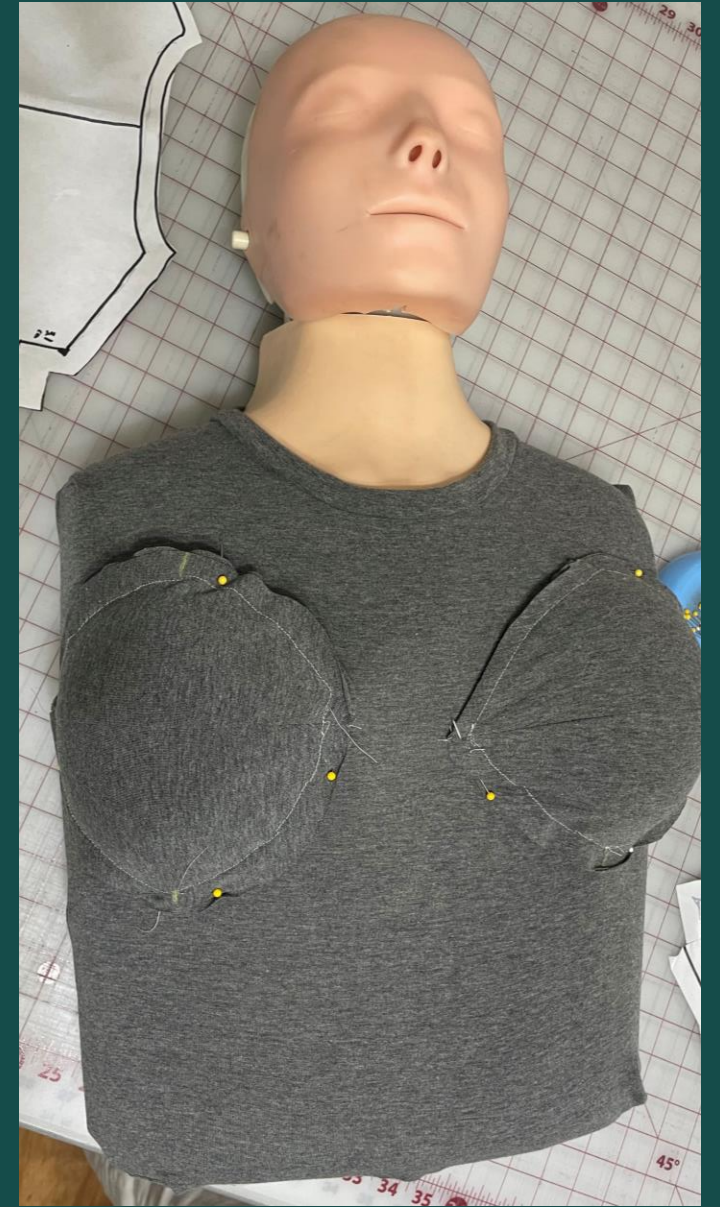
Thank you, anonymous donor

- Copied from open-source instructions



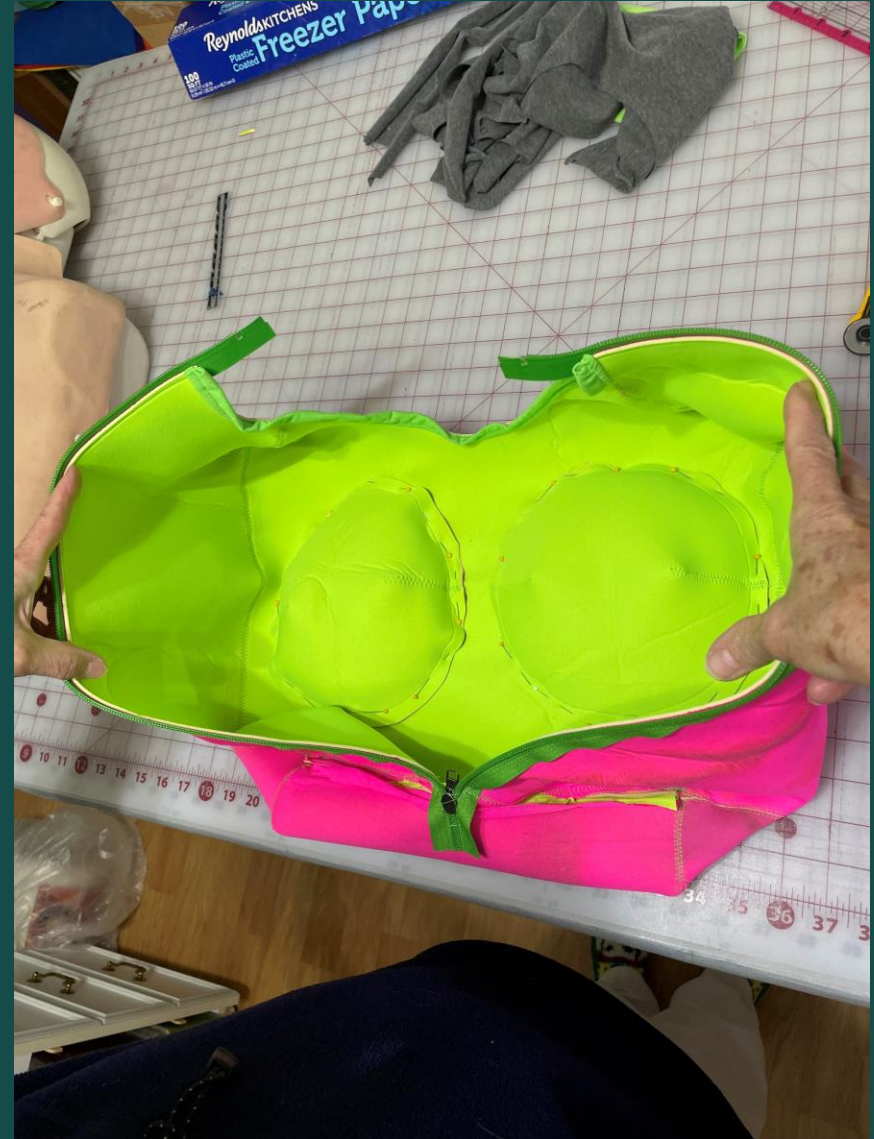


Neoprene Prototype

- Very expensive and limited materials
- High stakes!

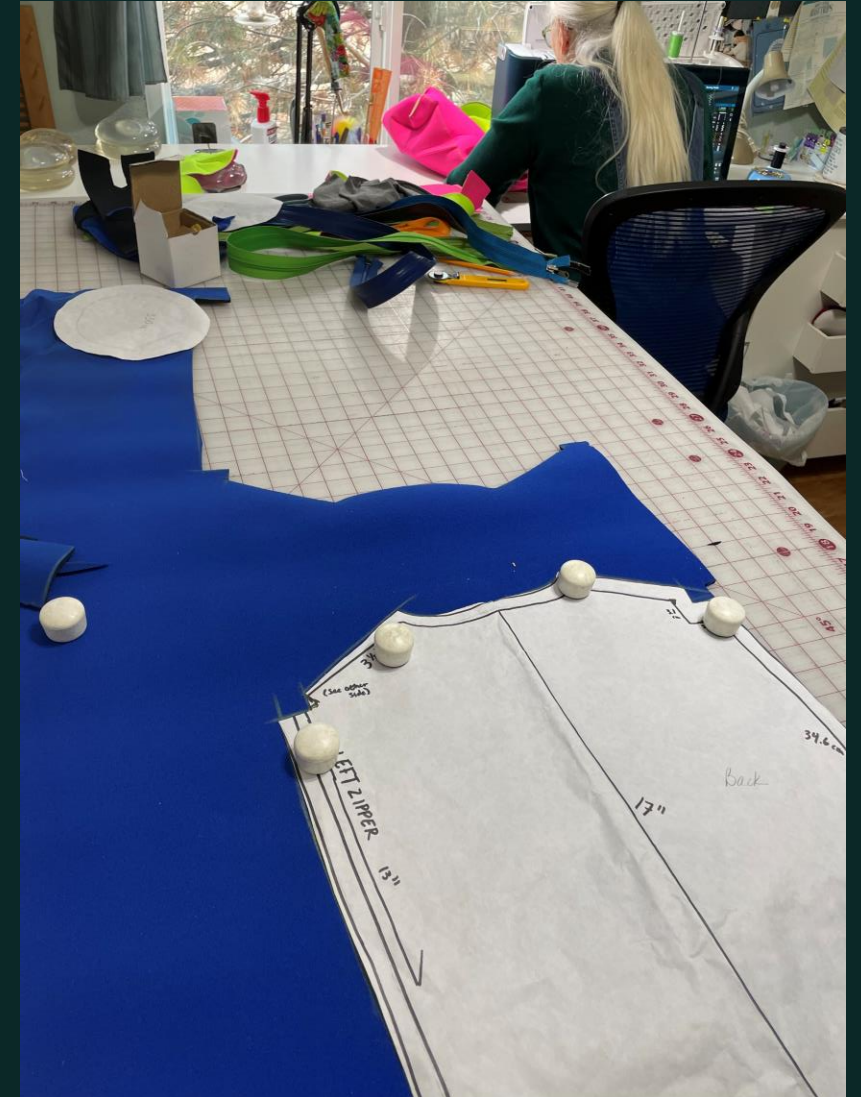


Final Product-Neon Green

- Thicker fabric
- More difficult to sew
- Less material
- Even higher stakes!



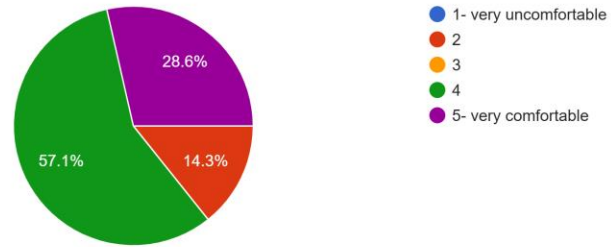
Making Swimsuits

- Disrobing



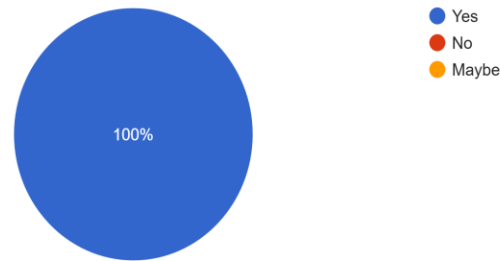
What was your comfortability with performing CPR on women before this in service

7 responses



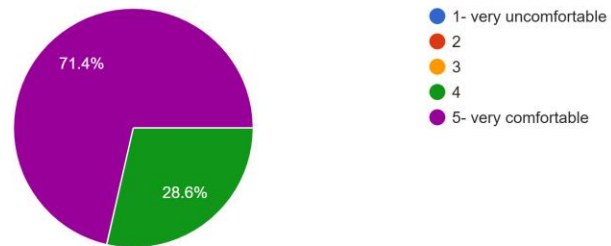
Do you feel more confident in your abilities after receiving more training and exposure

Impact and Reception

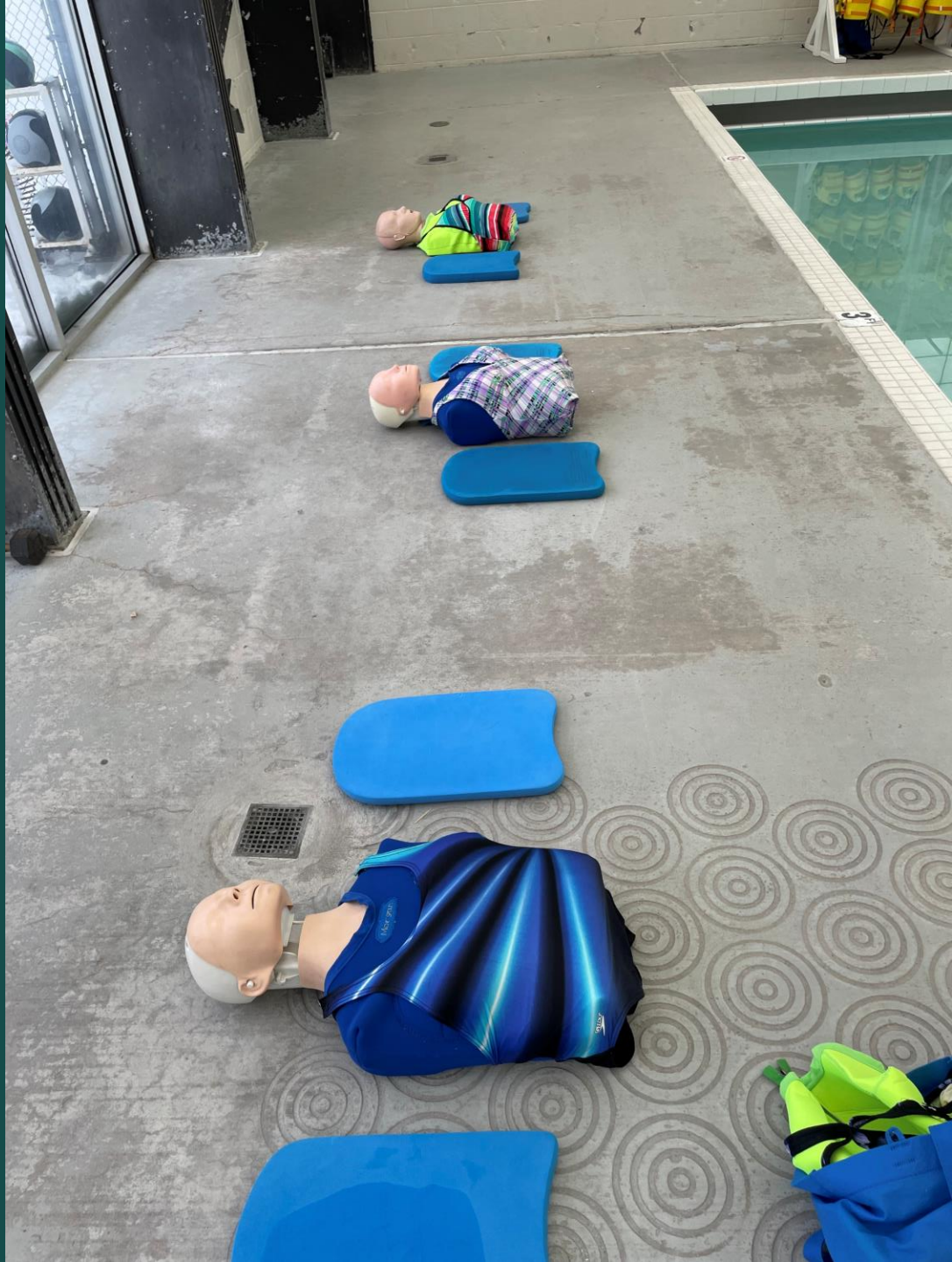
- Wonderful reception from guards
