Dear Sirs and Madams, I have a child who attends the Sierra Kids program at Hunter Lake Elementary School through the Parks and Recreation department. He has attended it for three years and we consider it a part of his overall school success. We were recently informed that this program is no longer being offered at this location after this year. The rules of the program prohibit us from using another site. I would like to propose that this decision be reconsidered. There are currently 41 children enrolled in this program at this location meaning this decision impacts approximately 30 voting families. Continuing to attend this program will provide important stability to our children. An alternative private care program has been offered as a substitute but we know families who have sent their children to this facility and have reported staff disengagement, bullying, and no structure for the children. All these issues are non-existent at our current location. We have been told this program is being closed to make room for a similar program at another location. We have also been told that the principals of both these schools are unhappy with this transition but have been told there is no recourse. I would propose that these decisions be made in conjunction with community partners to

benefit the largest number of citizens who truly desire the service. If this is, in fact, a resource issue, I would submit that continuing it for those already enjoying the benefit until additional resources are identified is a less disruptive course. This program is close to Reno High School providing valuable work experience to students after school. We fostered a child last year who was able to work at this location after her school day. She would not have been able to participate at another location because of lack of reliable transportation. We fear that others may be missing this important opportunity with this closure. Most importantly, this program has been an important part of our child's community. Teachers and school staff are often available to assist students thanks to it being on site. The staff truly cares about our child and contacts us when they expect him to be there but he is absent; this location gives us the convenience of informing staff when we pick up our child early. As a family, we have made strong connections with other families who attend the school and this program; we do not feel we will get the same sense of connection at the alternative offered. The Parks and Recreation department is losing an effective community building tool through the closure of this program. This is not just a daycare to us. This is an important part of our child's community and upbringing in this city. We hope this decision to close the program at this location can be reconsidered prior to the start of next year. Thank you for your time.
