


Background

January 12, 2022

Council adopted Ordinance No. 6618

- ✓ Safe Scape Regulation moved from Title 18 to Title 5
- ✓ Requirement to sell fresh or frozen perishable foods
- ✓ Limitations on specific products based on serving size
- ✓ Expansion of the applicable area
- ✓ Additional Council discretion when considering applications
- ✓ Compliance review provisions

Applicability




- Applies to 35 package alcohol/package wine and beer licenses.
- Buffer Area extends 1,000 feet outward from the Downtown Safe Scape Area and East 4th Street.

Requirements

Carried over from Title 18:


- Height marker at each exit.



- Existing glass coverage on storefront shall not be reduced or eliminated.



- "Under video surveillance" sign displayed.



- Video surveillance cameras. Must maintain video for 24 hours.



- No outdoor merchandise/displays between the building and the adjacent right-of-way.



- Entry detectors.



- ATM and vending machines should be secured to floor and/or wall and not less than 10 feet from entrance or exit.



- No outdoor storage.



- Window and facade security. *(When applicable)*
Metal bars or gates on windows, shall be located on the interior side of the window.
- Door security. *(When applicable)*
Metal accordion gate or grill-type doors, shall be located within the building interior. Secured doors shall be equipped with metal guides tracks at top and bottom, and a cylinder lock and/or padlock. The bottom track shall be so designed that the door cannot be lifted from the track when the door is in a locked position.



- No obstruction of more than 25% of the windows.



Requirements

New provisions:

- No distilled spirits in containers of less than 375 milliliters.



- No wine in containers of less than 750 milliliters.



- Beer, malt liquor, wine coolers, and similar alcoholic beverages in less than 20 ounce containers cannot be sold unless in factory packaging of four-packs or greater.



- Fresh or Frozen Perishable Food.



At least ten percent (10%) of the retail floor space must be dedicated to fresh or frozen perishable foods. Fresh or frozen perishable food means those foods likely to spoil, decay, or become unsafe to consume if not kept refrigerated or frozen. Examples of foods that must be kept refrigerated for safety include, but are not limited to, fruits, vegetables, egg, meat, poultry, seafood, and dairy products. Fresh food may also include foods that have extended expiration dates, including but not limited to, fruits and vegetables not requiring refrigeration, canned food, condiments, dried meat and bakery items.

Reno Municipal Code ("RMC") Sec. 5.07.123 was adopted to safeguard property and promote public health, safety and welfare in and around the businesses; prevent crime, illegitimate behavior and nuisance behavior in and around the businesses; protect the City's investment in the redevelopment of the downtown areas, maintain and revitalize downtown property values; preserve and improve the quality of the City's downtown neighborhoods and commercial districts; and preserve and improve the quality of urban life.

Effective July 12, 2023, package alcohol/package wine and beer licensees located within the Downtown Safe Scape Area, Downtown Safe Scape Buffer Area, and the East 4th Street Corridor Safe Scape Buffer Area as depicted in RMC Sec. 5.07.123(a) are subject to an annual review pursuant to RMC Sec. 5.07.123 (j)(2).
