Dear Madame City Clerk:

In addition to this cover letter, please also find included in this pdf file my Application Form and Resume.

The remainder of this letter is a fuller explanation of my reasons for wanting to be appointed to the Planning Commission than was allowed by the space on the Application Form. I will also summarize why I feel ready for that challenge.

The Planning Commission plays a key role in analyzing, evaluating, and rendering decisions on a wide variety of development-related applications. During my time as a member of the Ward 5 NAB I have worked hard to research and understand those development applications that came to our agenda. As part of the advisory role of the NAB members, I have carefully documented my concerns, thoughts, and opinions about each of these applications for the benefit of the Planning Commissioners. I feel well prepared to spend the time necessary to broaden my impact on project applications to include all five wards of the City of Reno.

While I have paid particular attention to the concerns raised by existing residents affected by new development projects, I am scrupulously objective in evaluating <u>all</u> the pertinent information that should be considered. My usual process of preparing for a NAB meeting has five steps:

- 1. Pull down the project documentation from Accela.
- 2. Thoroughly read the documentation and generate initial thoughts and questions.
- 3. Refer to the relevant sections of the Master Plan and Land Development Code.
- 4. Contact the Planner responsible for the project and discuss my questions, concerns, and opinions.
- 5. Re-review all the information and settle on questions and comments for the NAB meeting.
- During the NAB meeting, I listen carefully to the applicant's presentation as well as to the questions and comments from my NAB colleagues and I may also ask questions of the applicant. If this generates new questions, I will ask them of the attending Planner. The next morning, I collect my thoughts and feel very well prepared to write my online advisory comments for the Planning Commissioners.

While it is hard to not bring some prior experiences to bear when reviewing projects, I feel it is absolutely imperative to bring an open mind to each project. I lean heavily on the Master Plan to guide me on what the general public expressed as its expectations for the various parts of the City. The Land Development Code helps with specific details that make concrete the expectations the City has for the nature of development projects. Despite the Master Plan and Code, I must admit that I have seen quite different interpretations of the relevant parts of these documents at Planning Commission meetings. For example, while some can make the necessary "findings", others cannot. It is therefore always important to gain as clear an understanding of the Master Plan and Code before fully considering a wider range of opinions and interpretations.

I want to stress how much I have valued the help of several Planners in the Development Services Department. They have been unfailingly patient as I discuss my questions and concerns, and I will always give the highest attention to the advice they give. That said, I have not always agreed with their recommendations (for example, the content of specific conditions applied to a CUP), and I will politely agree to differ if my research leads me to a different conclusion.

Sometimes that different conclusion is the result of input from existing residents. While I give full, objective attention to the development applicants, I feel they have a built-in advantage over residents in that they cannot match the organizational resources nor focus of developers. On the NAB, I have given equal time to fully understand residents' concerns, and I would continue to do so if I were appointed to the Planning Commission.

I often follow projects that have reached the NAB through to the Planning Commission, and on to the City Council. There has been much to learn from listening to all the viewpoints of those decision-makers, and I recognize the significant burden that responsibility confers. One example is the update given to attune Council Members to the window opening in 2025 for TIF opportunities, and Planning Commissioners will no doubt weigh in on projects vying for funding in RDA1.

Finally, I want to be true to my ethical and considerate approach to all stakeholders. While I value passion for what one believes, I value even more a tempered approach to communicating one's beliefs. Being on the public record holds a responsibility to address all politely, fairly, and with respect, no matter differences of opinion. Whenever I say: "For the Record, Gary Cecil", I realize I can set a public example to others of how we can engage in civil discourse.

I hope you will take the time to contact me so we can fully discuss my fit and readiness to serve on the Planning Commission.
