Public comment is limited to three (3) minutes per person. Unused time may not be reserved by the speaker, nor allocated to another speaker. No action may be taken on a matter raised under general public comment until the matter is included on a subsequent agenda and denoted as an action item. On specific agenda items, the presiding officer may prohibit comment if the content of the comments is a topic that is not relevant to, or within the authority of, the City Council, or if the content is willfully disruptive of the meeting by being irrelevant, repetitious, slanderous, offensive, inflammatory, irrational or amounting to personal attacks or interfering with the rights of other speakers. Other examples of disruptive conduct include, without limitation, yelling, stamping of feet, whistles, applause, heckling, name calling, use of profanity, personal attacks, physical intimidation, threatening use of physical force, assault, battery, or any other acts intended to impede the meeting or infringe on the rights of City

Council members, city staff, or meeting participants. Any person making willfully disruptive remarks while addressing City Council may be removed from the room by the presiding officer, and barred from attending the remainder of the meeting. See, Nevada Attorney General Opinion No. 00-047 (April 27, 2001); Nevada Open Meeting Law Manual, § 8.05. NRS 241.030(4)(a); RMC §§ 8.12.024, 8.12.027.

Council Member Duerr pulled this item so it would not go unrecognized in a Consent Agenda. She discussed today's groundbreaking celebration and noted the importance of the Pennington Foundation's pledge.

Council Member Brekhus stated for the record "I echo a lot of her statements but I want to understand some of the language of this contract about what the title of this facility is. As we heard today from Michael Ginsburg, it's a facility that was birthed in 1905 and in 1957 the City of Reno took position of that property. So there has been a lot of investment on this property, owning that land by prior residents, and the Council's decision to bond in the future vast majority of this project costs is a cost that will be borne by future residents. Some may not even be born or even live here now. So I want to understand the name of the facility.

Kerrie Koski, City of Reno Director of Public Works, stated the name of the facility is the Moana Springs Community Aquatics Facility.

Council Member Brekhus stated for the record "The agreement says the building will be named something. What will the building be named?

Ms. Koski stating it will be named the Moana Springs Community Aquatic Center and then we will have the William N. Pennington name above the building itself.

Council Member Brekhus stated okay, but the facility, the grounds and all else will be named Moana.

Ms. Koski stated the pool facility, yes.

Council Member Brekhus stated yes, the grounds. And it's going to be named the William Pennington pool or an auditorium?

Ms. Koski stated William M. Pennington Moana Springs Community Aquatic Center.

Council Member Brekhus stated so that name gets first billing before Moana Springs. She stated that she thought it's the Moana Springs facility and then within that you have the Pennington Pool.

Jaime Schroeder, City of Reno Director of Parks and Recreation, explained that in 2012 the parcel itself was named the Moana Springs Recreational Complex. The pool will be called the William M. Pennington Moana Springs Community Aquatics and Fitness Center. We will work with the Pennington Foundation on how we will put that lettering on the building.

Council Member Brekhus discussed the need to not have confusion regarding the name going forward. It is important to her that the Moana Springs name be consistent and that we don't under bill that because it is a tremendous link to our history's past. With this dialogue and statements, she can move forward but wishes this was brought before the Historic Resources Commission.

“In the interest of full transparency I am disclosing the fact that my husband, Armando Ornelas Jr., is the Community Services Director for the City of Sparks and Agenda Item B.8 is a proposal for a professional services agreement between the cities of Reno and Sparks and Stantec to obtain gas conditioning system improvements design services for the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility. Total cost of the agreement is \$205,790.49. Based on the cities’ joint ownership of the facility and existing cost sharing arrangement, Reno will pay approximately two-thirds and Sparks will pay one-third of that total cost of the contract. On this matter I have sought guidance from the City Attorney’s office. Here, because Reno and Sparks have an existing cost sharing agreement, and the parties share the same public regional waste water treatment goals and objectives, my commitment in a private capacity to the interests of my spouse as an employee of the City of Sparks would not clearly and materially affect the independence of judgement of a reasonable person in my position to warrant an abstention under NRS.”
