### **Summary:**

The 82nd Session of the Nevada Legislature began on February 6, 2023. In an effort to keep Council informed about the legislative process, staff has periodically provided updates and answered questions on various bills and other legislative matters at regularly-scheduled Council meetings between February and June 2023. The Legislature adjourned Sine Die on Monday, June 5.

### **Previous Council Action:**

January 11, 2023 – Council adopted the 2023 Legislative Platform and Operations Plan, which guides the City's position on proposed legislation and various policy issues.

August 11, 2022 – Council provided direction and selected the topic for the City's one bill draft request (BDR) for the 2023 legislative session. Council directed staff to actively pursue and advocate for efforts to advance affordable housing legislation that will align with the City's legislative policy platform.

#### **Discussion:**

The 82nd Session of the Nevada Legislature began on February 6, 2023. Staff has tracked

proposed legislation with potential impacts to the City, actively engaged in discussion with state lawmakers, and coordinated with other units of local government and stakeholders to enact legislation favorable to local government. Since the legislative process moves quickly in the 120-day session, staff has periodically provided informational updates at regularly-scheduled Council meetings while the Legislature is in session. Staff has provided information about the status of key legislation and answered questions from Council. In advance of these presentations, staff has provided an updated bill tracking document with the latest information about bills that are being monitored.
