My name is Alan Jordan, and I am addressing you as an individual who lives in Reno, not as a member of a group.

First, I would like to thank you for everything that Reno does to help stabilize our climate. I am aware of efforts like the recent LEED Gold Certification, the continuous addition of EVs to your vehicle fleet, and the infrastructure created that promotes micro-mobility.

I understand the realities of governmental budget constraints because I retired as a Management Analyst III from the State of Nevada. I feel that you want to make appropriate, balanced decisions that will empower Reno to continue to thrive, even in the face of external threats such as wildfires in California that the wind blows into our county, resulting in substantial air pollution. I understand that the basis for making these decisions is accurate and timely information, and I have two suggestions that are likely to save money.

1. Ask Citizens' Climate Lobby (CCL), a nonprofit, nonpartisan grassroots advocacy climate change organization with over 530 local chapters, including a Reno-Sparks chapter, for assistance when you need research. It is a useful

resource when your needs go beyond the ability of resources like University of Nevada-Reno to provide on a rapid-as-requested basis. The organization has many resources and has demonstrated that they are willing to deploy them. The email address for the Reno-Sparks chapter listed on the website is

I wanted to start off by saying thank you for taking the time to read my letter. I know you guys are extremely busy.



I keep up with the Reno council meetings on YouTube, and I also watch Ward 5 meetings as well. I have known both of these individuals for a while, and I thought a few things should be brought to your attention. Both of these individuals were fired from the previous establishment they worked at, Peppermint Hippo, for foul behavior with patrons and fellow employees. I have spoken directly with the general manager, and he has warned the nightlife community of their intentions.

I have attached the link for Jessica and Wolfgang's social media accounts. I could see in court that they seemed very professional and polite, but this is far from how these individuals operate. They are very risqué, inappropriate, and have a very strong connection with the drug dealers in Reno. The content that they post is not something we want to support in our growing community.

She has bragged on social media about how she sells her body online and is going to use the bar to promote that. This is a very disturbing thing to accept as a woman. I don't like knowing that I live across the street from a business that is going to potentially allow people to do this inside of their establishment. They have already installed stripper poles and are planning a private underground dance area.

I hope my words have given you something to take into consideration. I love my area, and I love knowing my children will grow up here, but I am not sure that this area is necessarily appropriate for children anymore with the way things are going.

I am a Reno, NV native--born and raised here in the Biggest Little City. Despite making my life in Reno for over 30 years, this is the first time I have submitted a public comment to the RCC.



**Your Comment**

My name is Stephen Van Zee, I reside in Ward 5. My comments today concern the City's 9 Landscape Maintenance Districts.

First, I want to commend Councilwoman Taylor for reaching out to me late last year to discuss my many concerns with the City's LMDs. I appreciate her time and hope that our open dialogue will continue.

Because of time constraints, I will address only 2 issues; fire safety and unsupported fee assessments.

Regarding fire safety: For over 5 years, the City has refused to enforce a wildfire mitigation landscape maintenance requirement specified in its contracts with Garden Shop Nursery and Reliance Grounds Management. The requirement is to remove ALL vegetation within 6 feet of residential wood and see-through fences. In 2019, an Urban Forestry crew member alluded to me that the City's refusal was tied to the City's hard-line tree preservation policies. In response, I say this to the City of Reno: It's time to pull your head out of the sand and realize that tree protection policies cannot be all encompassing at the expense of lives and property!

Regarding unsupported fee assessments: Through multiple Public Record Requests, I have discovered that for FY 21-22 and the 8 previous years, the City has no official accounting records to support LMD fees assessed to homeowners, other than costs for the contracts between the City and Garden Shop Nursery. Let me repeat that: Other than costs paid to Garden Shop Nursery, the City has no official accounting records to support LMD fees assessed to property owners for 9 years, which means that the City has no records to support \$268,000 collected from property owners.

In addition, the City's records show that the City's calculation of fees to be assessed never included a 10% reduction to account for the City's share of landscape maintenance costs. The City's 10% obligation was spelled out in an August 2003 letter from the Department of Parks and Recreation, which means that for the same 9 years mentioned previously, the City has overbilled property owners at least \$42,000.

Because of these issues, I believe that the City is subjecting itself to several potential lawsuits:

- A class action lawsuit to compel enforcement of the wildfire mitigation landscape maintenance requirement. These are contract costs that property owners pay for.
- A class action lawsuit to recover unsupported and overbilled LMD fees assessed to property owners.
- Lawsuits from property owners who suffer loss of life and/or property due

to wildfire, if the City refuses to enforce the wildfire mitigation landscape maintenance requirement for LMDs.

<b>Your Comment</b>	For several months, a nearby neighbor has reported vehicles parked on my street as abandoned vehicles. Myself and my neighbors

come home from work/leave in the morning to see our tires chalked. Most of our vehicles move regularly, but we generally park them in front of our own homes, out of courtesy. After several instances of this, I began parking my vehicle in other places on the street to make it clear that it was moving. Reports of my vehicle being abandoned continued. Although I have never received a citation, I have spoken to the service request responders several times and have inquired about ways to remedy the situation/appease the reporter. They told me that parking in front of other neighbors' homes was not the right approach and that I was allowed to park my vehicle on the street in front of my home provided that it was parked in the right direction, had current registration, and was moved every 48 hours. Despite these criteria having been met, I continue to get visits from parking enforcement representatives and frequently find my tires chalked. In speaking with them, they agree that there is a neighbor who simply has a problem with other peoples' vehicles being parked on the street, and Reno Direct representatives appear to be annoyed from having to visit the same street because of the same complaints month after month. This is a waste of city resources and creates unnecessary tension for the hard-working people in my neighborhood. Most of us have busy work schedules, children with extracurriculars, doctor's appointments, etc and long walks from the house to the car, merely to

placate an unreasonable neighbor, are simply not practical. Parking enforcement have explained to me that they are not aware of any sort of policy mechanism that can be utilized to dismiss complaints from nuisance callers/reporters. I am concerned that if no such policy exists, then the Reno Direct service center can be used as a form of harassment. As far as I am aware, no reports of abandoned vehicles on my street are legitimate and none have resulted in any citations having been issued. I propose that a policy be implemented that provides for Reno Direct representatives to dismiss calls on vehicles that have been reported by the same person multiple times and have not resulted in citations. I have made it clear that I am willing to speak to whomever has an issue with me parking my vehicle on the street and have provided my phone number in my vehicle's windows and provided my phone number to parking enforcement personnel. I have not received a call up to this point, and I anticipate that in the absence of a policy mechanism to dismiss nuisance reports, my neighbors and I will continue to have our vehicles reported as abandoned and waste city resources.

#### 4. If it is a tax, then how can they tax exempt church property?

The Reno BID is a special assessment pursuant to NRS 271, not a tax pursuant to NRS 361. NRS Chapter 271 does not contain exemptions for churches and the exemption for churches set forth in NRS 361.125 does not apply.

#### 5. As discussed today, the additional question if Taxation has jurisdiction is that the BID/DMO would then be subject to Nevada Taxation oversight as they are a public body making governmental decisions including the annual increase.

At a minimum, the Reno BID/DMO is subject to the jurisdiction of the Department pursuant to the Local Government Budget and Finance Act, pursuant to NRS 354.474(1). For instance, the creation of a special assessment/local improvement district pursuant to NRS 271 would appear to trigger budget reporting responsibilities for contracts associated with the expenditure of the special assessment levies pursuant to NRS 354.5965.

#### **NRS 354.474 Applicability to local governments; "local government" defined.**

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and 3, the provisions of [NRS 354.470](#) to [354.626](#), inclusive, apply to all local governments. For the purpose of [NRS 354.470](#) to [354.626](#), inclusive:

(a) "Local government" means every political subdivision or other entity which has the right to levy or receive money from ad valorem or other taxes or any mandatory assessments, and includes, without limitation, counties, cities, towns, boards, school districts and other districts organized pursuant to [chapters 244A, 318, 318A](#) and [379](#) of NRS, [NRS 450.550](#) to [450.750](#), inclusive, and [chapters 474, 541, 543](#) and [555](#) of NRS, and any agency or department of a county or city which prepares a budget separate from that of the parent political subdivision.

(b) "Local government" includes:

(1) The Nevada Rural Housing Authority for the purpose of loans of money from a local government in a county whose population is less than 100,000 to the Nevada Rural Housing Authority in accordance with [NRS 354.6118](#). The term does not include the Nevada Rural Housing Authority for any other purpose.

(2) A regional authority formed pursuant to [NRS 315.7805](#) but, except as otherwise provided in subparagraph (1), does not include any other housing authority created by or pursuant to [chapter 315](#) of NRS.

2. An irrigation district organized pursuant to [chapter 539](#) of NRS shall fix rates and levy assessments as provided in [NRS 539.667](#) to [539.683](#), inclusive. The levy of such assessments and the posting and publication of claims and annual financial statements as required by [chapter 539](#) of NRS shall be deemed compliance with the budgeting, filing and publication requirements of [NRS 354.470](#) to [354.626](#), inclusive, but any such irrigation district which levies an ad valorem tax shall comply with the filing and publication requirements of [NRS 354.470](#) to [354.626](#), inclusive, in addition to the requirements of [chapter 539](#) of NRS.

3. An electric light and power district created pursuant to [chapter 318](#) of NRS shall be deemed to have fulfilled the requirements of [NRS 354.470](#) to [354.626](#), inclusive, for a year in which the district does not issue bonds or levy an assessment if the district files with the Department of Taxation a copy of all documents relating to its budget for that year which the district submitted to the Rural Utilities Service of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Please find enclosed various answers to questions posed in regards to the Reno Business Improvement District.

**1. The main issues here: Is the BID Tax Assessment a tax?**

No. The Reno BID assessments are special assessments, not general ad valorem taxes. The Reno Business Improvement District replaced two existing Special Assessment Districts.

**2. May the Treasurer seize and sell property for nonpayment of the assessment portion of a tax bill?**

Yes, NRS Chapter 271 specifically authorizes assessment lien sales by the municipal treasurer. *See NRS 271.545 through 271.630.*

NRS 271.410 states that any installment payment that is not paid in full on its due date shall cause the entire balance of the assessment (including unpaid interest) to come due and be payable immediately at the option of the municipality. If such action is taken by the municipality, it must be accompanied by foreclosure proceedings upon the property. (NRS 271.420 states that the payment of the assessment is secured by an assessment lien against the property.) If the unpaid installment is made prior to the day of the sale, however, foreclosure proceedings are stopped, and the right of the property owner to make annual installments on the remaining balance is restored as it was prior to the foreclosure action.

**3. Do NRS 361.4724 and Nevada Constitution Art 10 restraints apply to the Assessment?**

No, the partial abatements specified by NRS 361.4724 do not apply to the Reno BID assessments because the NRS 361.4724 only abates "the ad valorem taxes levied by a county" and the Reno BID is a municipal assessment.

No, Art. 10 Section 2 does not apply to directly to the Reno BID special assessments. However, as codified by NRS 271.270(2), bonds issued pursuant to NRS Chapter 271 are subject to the five cents per dollar limitation set forth in Art. 10 Section 2.
