Hello,

We live in south Reno. We pay a tax each quarter for the Damonte Water Drainage District to PAY for this new type of issue.

The historical rainfall in Reno is less than Phoenix. The fact that you currently only allocate only 7% of the sewer budget to

stormwater shows it not that important to you. If it was important, you would raise the sewer tax instead of some new tax that can be raised year after year.

We just watched the news this morning that the Old Stone Nursery at Toll Road @Geiger Grade was flooded. This was due to a canal that had not been mucked out; the canal is owned by the City of Reno/Washoe County (RTC). Someone was not doing their job. It's that simple. Are you folks really going to use stories like this to illustrate the need for this new tax?

Again, we live in a documented drainage district. We already pay for stormwater management. If you proceed with this plan, and want to keep it fair to all concerned, will you apply a credit to all of us who are already are doing our part to handle this issue?

All of our landscaping was approved by the district. It all flows to the street gutters when rain occurs, (meaningful rain is pretty rare) which then flows to the water shed. That is exactly what you want, right; More ground water in ponds to elevate the aquifer?

By the way, the current Sewer Tax goes up about 8% every ever year. This new tax will be the same! You're turning us into California!

As a government, you need to plan and save for possible exceptions, the unknowns. But it's a mistake to spend money for events that happen once every 10 years. If you build all this out, you'll have to maintain all that infrastructure every year, while it's rarely used or needed.

Don't let bureaucrats build their empire on the back of taxpayers.

No business does that.

Rethink this. Especially for neighborhoods that already pay for stormwater handling.

Or, exempt these neighborhoods from this new tax, because we're already doing our part.
